
The New Mexico SBDC is funded through the US Small Business Administration and the New Mexico Higher Education Department as a line item under Santa Fe Community College.

- The New Mexico SBDC economic impact is verified.


In 2016 the program assisted with the creation of 1019 new jobs and saved 576 jobs that would have been lost due to business closure.

Since 1992 the program has assisted clients with starting 9,020 new businesses, and obtaining \$804,247,915 in loans and equity.
