## Our Vision

The Jemez Mountain Public Schools will graduate students prepared with the knowledge and skills essential to function in a democratic society.

### **Our Mission**

The Jemez Mountain Public Schools will work with families and the community to provide sound academic programs, proficient staff, adequate support services, responsible fiscal management and safe facilities conducive to learning. We will support a vision of excellence that students may reach their fullest potential as educated citizens.

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## DEMOGRAPHICS

The Jemez Mountain Public Schools serves students from various communities within 1,655 square miles in Rio Arriba County. The student make up is predominantly Hispanic and Native American. Currently, the district enrollment is 199 students, which is a 10% increase from the 2018-19 school year. Approximately 97% of students use district transportation with the longest route being 62 miles round trip. The district transportation serves 1,655 square miles of rural roads and highways. Many of the families farm and ranch, or sell wood products to supplement their livelihoods. To maintain their lives, some residents travel 70 miles, one way, for work outside of the school boundary. The district remains committed to retention of students and teachers as we work to provide instructional support to students and professional growth opportunities.

- Increase rigorous instruction, student engagement, and learning opportunities for promoting postsecondary and work force readiness
- Capture instructional staff academic strengths and utilize endorsements in varying curriculum offerings
- Use of technology and assessment tools that will ensure and maximize student learning

#### **New Schedule**

Structured daily schedule to meet graduation requirements including and vary course offerings based on teacher's endorsement and partnership with post-secondary institutions.

#### AdvancED

As an accredited high school, our goal is to focus on district-wide accreditation and implement measured progress system.

#### Technology

District is implementing 1:1 Chromebooks for students enrolled in K-12. Video conferencing technology will be available for access to educational resources.

#### **Course Offerings**
