



Rural New Mexico Schools

- In 2018, 45 percent of students in the Zuni district scored at a Level 1 on the PARCC test.
- In 2018, only 3 percent of students in the Dulce schools were proficient in math.
- All of rural New Mexico is at 1.74 times the poverty line.
- Some Navajo communities have incomes of only 70 percent of the poverty line.
- New Mexico has the highest level of rural child poverty in the U.S. at 29.7 percent.

Teacher optimism has fallen dramatically, from 50% in 2018 to 34% in 2019. Teachers in grades K-5 have the lowest percentage at 40%.

75% of teachers say that stressors from the educational environment, whether from inside or outside the district, make it difficult for teachers to be their best in the classroom.
