2 K5+ Victories

- Extra 25 days of learning/Open to all.
- Service to families & community.
- Established routines and procedures allows the K5+ students to serve as models for the new students when the school year begins.
- STEM Theme integration allows for excellent extension and enrichment activities. (i.e. Human Body, Space)
- Per pupil allocation allows for the opportunity for a fully funded academic program.


3 K5+ Challenges


- Uncertainty in funding leaves the district open to significant unplanned expenses.
- Single capture date linked to the 40-day count makes financial planning a challenge.
- Challenge to recruit staff.
- Consistent student attendance.
- Mandate that requires students to stay with the same teacher does not allow us to meet program and student need. Changes occur in staffing that are beyond the district's control.
- Tend to get a higher proportion of families seeking remediation. Higher percentage of the "Three B's": Boys, Behaviors & Below proficient students.



6 K5+ Considerations

- State mandating year round schooling.
- Requiring attendance to the K5+ program.
- List of can's and cannot's.

Extended Learning Time (ELT): Victories

- All Los Lunas Schools students and staff participate.
- Per pupil allocation allows for the opportunity for a fully funded academic program.
- Same calendar for all.
- 10 days built in allows for teachers to extend and enrich curricula and remediate as needed throughout the year.
- It has been positively embraced by staff and the community.
- Opportunity to provide STREAM Clubs before and after school.
- Opportunity to provide additional Tier II supports before and after school.

8 Extended Learning Time (ELT): Challenges

- Short timeline and turnaround/Approved calendars & collective bargaining.
- Our unique circumstances created reporting challenges.
- Staffing.
- Teacher burnout.
- Voluntary participation means not all students opt in for the before and afterschool activities.
- Growing pains.

9 ELT Considerations

 Increase the number of hours that students need to be in school statewide to afford all students ELT opportunities.

 Allow districts to use ELT funds to increase career and technical education courses during the school day.
