

STATUS OF OUTSTANDING ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS AND LAWSUITS

- HSD and 5 remaining BH providers within days of reaching an agreement
- HSD recognizes substantial risk in this breach of contract case
- Breach of contract damages are not paid by Risk Management because not covered by NM Tort Claims Act
- HSD's goal for settling is to grow the BH workforce for New Mexicans and safeguard the fiscal status of the State
- The agreement will call for 2020 legislative appropriations to settle or the cases will continue
- Details of the agreement cannot be discussed until the agreement is reached



WE HOPE TO BRING SOME PROVIDERS BACK ON-LINE!

- 1. Assistance with Medicaid Provider Enrollment
- 2. Single point of contact at HSD and MCOs
- 3. Assistance with MCO Contracting and Credentialing
- 4. MCO Care Coordination contact

- One important task is to put these lawsuits to rest and work with providers to reopen and/or expand services
