



Number of AIAN COVID-19 Cases by Date






Number of AIAN COVID-19 Cases and As a Percentage of All COVID-19 Cases by Date






COVID-19 Age-adjusted Mortality Rateby Race/Ethnicity

COVID-19 Epidemiologic Response

NMDOH notified of positive COVID-19 test result

Case notification and investigation by tribal public health authority

Contact tracing – collect close contacts of case during infectious period

Contact monitoring for 14 days from last exposure

Case monitoring for 10 days* from symptom onset or date of test if asymptomatic

Coordinating response to outbreaks in congregate care and work place settings


*20 days for case with severe illness or severe immunosuppression




Public Health Authority

- **HIPAA** Privacy Rule recognizes the legitimate need for public health authorities to have access to protected health information
- Authority based on geographic boundaries not tribal affiliation or race
- Developed a protocol to delegate duties and respect tribe's public health authority
- Leveraged partnerships to respond to this unique public health challenge




Community Testing and Surveillance Process and Partnerships

- Developed strong working relationships with both IHS and tribal personnel in many communities
- We (DOH NW Region) have learned a lot from Tribal partners

- Agree with ERD: need for better data systems; better reporting of race/ethnicity data

- More lab capacity (not specific to the tribal response – but super important for any place with high case rates)

NM Department of Health Bureau of Health Emergency Management Department Operations Center (DOC)

- Fulfill COVID-19 test kit requests
- Transport COVID positive and Isolation patients
- Monitor ICU beds and ventilator usage in neighboring states (TX and AZ)
- Provide state-wide volunteer medical personnel and ancillary staff for shelters and alternate care sites through Medical Reserve Corp/NMSERVES
- Work with state-wide emergency managers for jurisdictional requests (i.e., cooling stations during the recent heat wave)



NM Department of Health, BHEM Department Operations Center (DOC)

- Manage the Battelle Critical Care Decontamination System (CCDS); 19,000 N-95 masks have been decontaminated to date
- Partner with the National Guard to deliver testing kits; to staff & equip alternate care sites; and in vaccine planning
- Collaborate with tribal partners in developing isolation and quarantine sites
- Collaborate with IHS partners in COVID-19 planning
