17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 10-7C-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1990,
19	Chapter 6, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:
20	"10-7C-4. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Retiree Health
21	Care Act:
22	A. "active employee" means an employee of a public
23	institution or any other public employer participating in
24	either the Educational Retirement Act, the Public Employees
25	Retirement Act, the Judicial Retirement Act, the Magistrate
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Retirement Act or the Public Employees Retirement Reciprocity
 Act or an employee of an independent public employer;

B. "authority" means the retiree health care authority created pursuant to the Retiree Health Care Act;

5 C. "basic plan of benefits" means only those
6 coverages generally associated with a medical plan of benefits;

D. "board" means the board of the retiree health care authority;

E. "current retiree" means an eligible retiree who is receiving a disability or normal retirement benefit under the Educational Retirement Act, the Public Employees Retirement Act, the Judicial Retirement Act, the Magistrate Retirement Act, the Public Employees Retirement Reciprocity Act or the retirement program of an independent public employer on or before July 1, 1990;

F. "eligible dependent" means a person obtaining retiree health care coverage based upon that person's relationship to an eligible retiree as follows:

(1) a spouse;

20 (2) [an unmarried] <u>a</u> child under the age of
21 [nineteen] <u>twenty-six</u> who is:

(a) a natural child;
(b) a legally adopted child;
(c) a stepchild living in the same
household who is primarily dependent on the eligible retiree

9 [(3) a child described in Subparagraphs (a) through (e) of Paragraph (2) of this subsection who is between 10 the ages of nineteen and twenty-five and is a full-time student 11 12 at an accredited educational institution; provided that "fulltime student" shall be a student enrolled in and taking twelve 13 or more semester hours or its equivalent contact hours in 14 primary, secondary, undergraduate or vocational school or a 15 student enrolled in and taking nine or more semester hours or 16 its equivalent contact hours in graduate school; 17

(4)] (3) a dependent child over [nineteen] twenty-six who is wholly dependent on the eligible retiree for maintenance and support and who is incapable of self-sustaining employment by reason of [mental retardation] intellectual disability or physical handicap; provided that proof of incapacity and dependency shall be provided within thirty-one days after the child reaches the limiting age and at such times thereafter as may be required by the board;

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1 [(5)] (4) a surviving spouse defined as 2 follows: "surviving spouse" means the spouse 3 (a) to whom a retiree was married at the time of death; or 4 "surviving spouse" means the spouse 5 (b) to whom a deceased vested active employee was married at the 6 7 time of death; or [(6)] (5) a surviving dependent child who is 8 9 the dependent child of a deceased eligible retiree and whose other parent is also deceased; 10 "eligible employer" means either: G. 11 12 (1) a "retirement system employer", which means an institution of higher education, a school district or 13 14 other entity participating in the public school insurance authority, a state agency, state court, magistrate court, 15 municipality, county or public entity, each of which is 16 affiliated under or covered by the Educational Retirement Act, 17 the Public Employees Retirement Act, the Judicial Retirement 18 Act, the Magistrate Retirement Act or the Public Employees 19 20 Retirement Reciprocity Act; or an "independent public employer", which (2) 21 means a municipality, county or public entity that is not a 22 retirement system employer; 23 "eligible retiree" means: н. 24 (1) a "nonsalaried eligible participating 25 .218423.2

15	(a) falls within the definition of a
16	retiree, has made contributions to the fund for at least five
17	years prior to retirement and whose eligible employer during
18	that period of time made contributions as a participant in the
19	Retiree Health Care Act on the person's behalf, unless that
20	person retires on or before July 1, 1995, in which event the
21	time period required for employee and employer contributions
22	shall become the period of time between July 1, 1990 and the
23	date of retirement, and who is certified to be a retiree by the
24	educational retirement director, the executive secretary of the
25	public employees retirement board or the governing authority of
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1 an independent public employer;

2 (b) falls within the definition of a retiree, retired prior to July 1, 1990 and is certified to be a 3 retiree by the educational retirement director, the executive 4 secretary of the public employees retirement association or the 5 governing authority of an independent public employer; but this 6 7 paragraph does not include a retiree who was an employee of an 8 eligible employer who exercised the option not to be a 9 participating employer pursuant to the Retiree Health Care Act and did not after January 1, 1993 elect to become a 10 participating employer; unless the retiree: 1) retired on or 11 12 before June 30, 1990; and 2) at the time of retirement, did not have a retirement health plan or retirement health insurance 13 coverage available from the retiree's employer; or 14

(c) is a retiree who: 1) was at the time of retirement an employee of an eligible employer who exercised the option not to be a participating employer pursuant to the Retiree Health Care Act, but which eligible employer subsequently elected after January 1, 1993 to become a participating employer; 2) has made contributions to the fund for at least five years prior to retirement and whose eligible employer during that period of time made contributions as a participant in the Retiree Health Care Act on the person's behalf, unless that person retires prior to the eligible employer's election to become a participating employer or less .218423.2

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1 than five years after the date participation begins when the 2 participation date begins before July 1, 2009, in which event 3 the time period required for employee and employer contributions shall become the period of time, if any, between 4 the date participation begins and the date of retirement or 5 when the participation date begins on or after July 1, 2009, in 6 7 which event the person and employer shall contribute to the fund an amount equal to the full actuarial present value of the 8 9 accrued benefits as determined by the authority; and 3) is certified to be a retiree by the educational retirement 10 director, the executive director of the public employees 11 12 retirement board or the governing authority of an independent public employer; 13

(5) a "former participating employer governing authority member", which means a person, other than a nonsalaried eligible participating entity governing authority member or a salaried eligible participating entity governing authority member, who is not a retiree and who served as a member of the governing authority of a participating employer for at least four years but is no longer a member of the .218423.2
