Economic Recovery Efforts



- Awarded \$750,000 in direct business support grants
- \$364,000 in outdoor dining and retail grants
- Proposed \$10 million to council in additional small business support
- Waived \$1 million in inspection, permitting, and business registration fees
- Allocated \$1 million for PPE to be distributed to small businesses
 - **Announced Minority Business Development Center opening this**

Carving Our Own Path



Economy

- Provided direct grant funding to ABQ businesses
- Providing PPE to businesses
- Funding outside dining to restaurants
- Executing public works and construction
- \$10M on way for direct support (council vote pending)

Health

- Activated Emergency Operations
 Center and established testing sites
- Issued clear emergency orders and kept public informed on changes
- Focused on compliance rather than punishment for enforcement
- Kept the safety net in place, parks, open space, providing rental assistance and food

Safety

- Kept first responders responding to calls for service with COVIDsafe practices in place
- Ordered 'stay home' rather than 'curfew'
- Graduated 100 officers
- Deputized AFR, DMD
- Prevented budget cuts to public safety efforts
