

Water Security Tribal Advisory Council

Interim Committee - 2024

Short-term committee comprised of water leaders and technical staff whose goal was to develop a framework for WSTAC. Convening were coordinated with the NM Indian Affairs Department.

Tribal Advisory Council – late 2024

Inaugural meeting October 2024. Initial focus on providing input for rules and guidelines, including consideration of tribal-specific content, determining ongoing role and process for council, and engaging in regional planning.
