
NEW MEXICO HEALTH CARE AUTHORITY GOALS

HEALTH CARE AUTHORITY ORGANIZATIONAL CHART PER SB 16






FY25 HEALTH CARE AUTHORITY BUDGET REQUEST

- In FY25, HCA will serve 1,091,376 New Mexicans (52% of population) with a proposed request (with expansions) of \$12.89 B (\$2.29 B GF. Request addresses:
 - Health care coverage innovations and provider network supports.
 - Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program expansions.
 - Infrastructure investments to meet Federal requirements.
- Per 2023 Senate Bill 16, we will submit a transition plan to the Legislature in November, outlining additional HCA details, organization, and priorities.



LEVERAGING HSD'S EXPERTISE TO IMPROVE HEALTH COVERAGE


- State employee health plans will benefit from moving into the HCA.
 - HCA promotes efficiency through consolidation, streamlining administrative processes and reducing duplication, resulting in long-term cost savings for plan holders and state government.
 - State employee health plans will benefit from Medicaid expertise in identifying gaps in coverage, plan design, plan administration, improving benefits, cost management, data management, and healthcare access.
 - Increased coordination between Medicaid and state health plans allows the State to better align healthcare delivery and policies, improving overall healthcare outcomes.
