

- Continuing High School Career Counselors -\$1.28M
- Continuing Be Pro Be Proud \$2.035M
- Continuing Pre-Apprenticeship \$1.213M
- Labor Relations Division staffing \$641,400
 - Public works case loads have gone from 70 to 92 per person
 - Wage and Hour saw a 73% increase in Q1 FY24 comp. to Q1 FY23
- IT Legally required wage & hour database -\$100,000




Unemployment Claims





Estimated Employment Gap






NM's Labor Force Participation Rate Since January 2020
