Our district receives approximately 18,000 cases per year, nearly 50% of the total yearly criminal caseload in the state and receives over 125 felony cases per week. The nature and complexity of the cases we handle has made it a priority for our office to provide as many resources to our attorneys and support staff as possible, which is reflected in the submitted FY25 appropriation request.

Notes:

- > Initial FY25 Appropriation Request in BFM used the vacancy rate tool which over inflated the personal services and employee benefits. Manual projections were submitted to DFA and LFC with the accurate requested amount of \$31.9 million for salary and benefits.
- > FY25 Request for the general fund includes a 0% vacancy rate to fill all positions as well as \$266.7 thousand expansion for physical security including 3 additional FTE.
- Reduction in federal revenues effectively decreased contractual services due to the expiration of the Community Based Crime Reduction (CBCR) grant.
