- ◆ Created in 2001, NMFA serves as staff to the 16-member board and administers the Water Project Fund
- ◆ Board's duties are to authorize NMFA to make loans and grants to now six types of water projects: 1) Storage, conveyance or delivery of water to end users; 2) Federal Endangered Species Act implementation projects; 3) Restoration and management of watersheds; 4) Flood prevention; 5) Water conservation or recycling, treatment or reuse of water; and 6) Wastewater Projects
- ◆ The Act created two funds from which NMFA makes grants and loans recommended by the Water Trust Board and authorized by the Legislature:
 - ❑ Water Trust Fund, an SIC-managed permanent fund, that makes annual distributions to the Water Project Fund
 - ❑ Water Project Fund, established in the NMFA, receives annual distribution from Water Trust Fund (historically \$4 million) and receives a net 8.1% earmark of senior severance tax bonds
- ◆ In 2024, the NMFA was authorized to use Water Project Funds to pay for technical assistance and capacity development. The WTB and NMFA have approved two uses of these fund: 1) facilitation of regionalization and 2) small system planning

Activities of Note – Changes from HB 211



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- Rulemaking process: On December 17, 2024, the WTB authorized the initiation of the rulemaking process for proposed amendments to the Rules to incorporate revisions made to the Water Project Finance Act under HB 211 in 2024. The final Rule amendments were adopted by the WTB on April 2, 2025.
- Wastewater Conveyance and Treatment: NMFA staff is working with NMED staff in developing evaluation and readiness criteria for the wastewater projects for inclusion in the WTB's Water Project Fund Project Management Policies ("Policies"). Final criteria expected in July 2025 ahead of the 2026 application opening.
- Technical Assistance Program ("TAP"): On August 7, 2024, the WTB approved a set-aside of \$3.5 million to hire contractor(s) to provide technical assistance to water systems. The technical assistance will focus primarily on
 - facilitating regionalization and
 - individual system planning.

On December 17, 2024, the WTB approved the policies governing the TAP. NMFA issued an RFP and selected a broad team of contractors to provide the services. Systems needing assistance may submit letters of interest beginning in June.

Activities of Note – Project Cost Overruns

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- The WTB began reserving portions of annual funding to cover cost overruns
 - 2021: 29 projects totaling \$51,035,518. 2 projects still in construction
 - 2021: \$2,280,398 set aside for cost overruns. Current Balance \$184,212. 4 projects received cost overrun awards
 - La Cueva MDWCA \$105,500
 - Rodarte MDWCA \$540,000
 - Rio Lucio DWCA \$250,686
 - Union del Llano MDWCA \$1,200,000
 - 2022: 31 projects totaling \$66,938,000. 13 open awards – 12 of which are construction projects; 8 have not started construction
 - 2022: \$5,100,000 set aside for cost overruns. Current Balance \$5,100,000
 - 2023: 50 projects totaling \$122,442,762 were awarded. 44 open awards – 33 of which are construction projects; 19 have not started construction
 - 2023: \$6,066,277 set aside for cost overruns. Current Balance \$6,066,277
 - 2024: 53 projects totaling \$163,835,366. 38 of the awards included construction. Most have not yet started construction.
 - 2024: \$6,739,082 set aside for cost overruns. Current Balance \$ 6,739,082
- In 2024, the Legislature appropriated \$18 million for Cost Overruns in projects awarded before 2024 (SB275). One cost overrun award made to date. Remaining balance \$16,800,000
 - Cerro Regional MDA (2020) \$1,200,000

◆ Annual Application Process

□ Agency evaluation using WTB policy forms the basis of the recommendation

- Watershed projects reviewed by ENMRD, NMED, and Dept. of Agriculture – scores averaged
- All others evaluated by NMED, NMFA and ISC
- Evidence of appropriate planning required for all design and/or construction projects
- Water Trust Board vets project management recommendation and recommends projects to be authorized by the Legislature to receive funding from NMFA

□ Authorized projects complete Project Readiness Application

- Projects not meeting regulatory compliance – including compliance with State Audit Act, Drinking Water Bureau regulations, and demonstration of appropriate water rights for project – are bypassed for funding

□ NMFA makes funding awards based upon specific recommendations by the Water Trust Board


2025 Funding Cycle


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- \$157,845,329 was available for awards from Severance Tax Bond earmarks and Water Trust Fund Distribution.
- The Legislature also appropriated \$200 million in general funds for projects authorized in 2025 and 2026
- In April, the WTB recommended the NMFA make awards to 60 applicants from the 2025 Application Cycle totaling \$146,603,384
 - 42 Water Storage, Conveyance, and Delivery Projects totaling \$97,917,033
 - 12 Flood Control Projects totaling \$29,801,138
 - 3 Water Conservation, Treatment & Reuse Projects totaling \$16,985,213
 - 3 Watershed Restoration and Management Projects totaling \$1,900,000
- 42 of the recommended projects include construction in the project scope
- 2 projects were recommended for smaller scopes because of project readiness
 - Bosque Gardens requested \$3.225 million for Design and Construction: \$553,924 recommended for design only
 - Storrie Water Users Association requested \$18 million for Design and Construction: \$2.35 million recommended for Design only
- The WTB will make a 2nd set of recommendations in August -- 10-15 projects are expected to receive awards totaling \$35 - \$45 million. These projects were not eligible for awards because they did not meet regulatory compliance – primarily due to late audits.



Total Funding Need by Dollars
















Amount of Project Funding by Applicant Type






Water Trust Board Awards by Project Type

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






