The Permian Strategic Partnership leverages its relationships with like-minded organizations, federal, state, and local leaders, and public partners to achieve more together than we ever could alone. Working in collaboration, we have increased funding for education, invested in career training, expanded healthcare access, improved safety and infrastructure, made housing more affordable for teachers, and expanded broadband access across the Permian Basin.

**\$2,100,000** Data, Research, & Outreach • The Perryman Group estimated total annual economic benefits\* of the oil and gas activity in the Permian Basin. Below are the findings:

#### For New Mexico:

- +\$22.1 billion per year in NM GDP

## Cal Ripken STEM Centers

- Of the 134 elementary schools in the Permian Basin that received STEM centers, 34 schools were in Eddy, Lea, and Chaves counties
- This initiative directly impacts
  - 15,857 New Mexico public school students
  - 1,008 New Mexico teachers
- This year, the PSP was awarded the Excellence in STEM Award by the Air Force Research Laboratory highlighting our work in New Mexico
  - The annual awards honor students, teachers, volunteers and other New Mexicans doing great things in science, technology, engineering and math education



## The Holdsworth Center

- The Holdsworth Center is an education leadership development center focused on improving the quality of public schools for public school students
- The goal is to identify high-potential future leaders for the <u>region</u>:
  - High-potential for leadership (skills, dispositions, capabilities)
  - Willing/open to leadership roles
  - Likely to be in the region in 5 years
- A stronger talent pool—quality, quantity, diversity benefits all districts and municipal schools in the region
- Artesia Public Schools, Carlsbad Municipal Schools, and Hobbs Municipal Schools are committed to the Campus Leadership and Collaborative Programs





## **Principal Internships**

- In the Permian Basin, we now have more principals with less than five years of school administrative experience than ٠ ever before. Educational research has shown that the principal ranks second only to teachers in determining and influencing student performance outcomes
- This opportunity will allow districts to have a sustained source of highly effective leaders at the campus level. Funding will allow districts to employ approximately 1-2 principal interns yearly
- The principal interns will serve under the leadership of a highly-effective principal and will be strategically placed at campuses where they can grow and develop. During the internship, principal interns will receive ongoing coaching and professional learning to build their campus leadership capacity
- Carlsbad Municipal Schools and Hobbs Municipal Schools have both been given \$1mm to employ principal interns for a period of five years

- Following the initial distribution of lifesaving equipment kits to 22 counties in 2021, a survey of the recipients was conducted to understand the effectiveness and suitability of donated equipment
- We found that First Responders utilized the donated equipment on a regular basis; noting the equipment has saved lives and improved First Responder safety, but key gaps remained
- Phase 2 of this initiative focused on increasing the number of life-saving equipment kits as well as compressed air foam systems, wildland fire/rescue clothing, and structure fire clothing all customized to each departments needs

- In New Mexico, residents outside of the Permian Basin have approached PBCG seeking services
- During Year 1 and 2, PBCG opened its stand-alone location in Carlsbad, and provided services in Hobbs, Jal, and Artesia in borrowed space
- Offering face-to-face services in these additional cities was ahead of the original planed dates and goals of the program
- In New Mexico, the initiative ended Year 2 with four full-time non-independent providers, one intake specialist, and the regional director
- In the first quarter of Year 3, the initiative is already exceeding the expectations for the year
- In February, PBCG started delivering in-person services to all Artesia residents at a second location and conducted the grand opening of its stand-alone location in Hobbs
- In addition to these successes in New Mexico, the initiative hired a fifth counselor for the area, who is independently licensed, and a case manager to serve veterans and family members

- The program initiated a comprehensive development campaign led by America's Warrior Partnership (AWP) to support the Permian Warrior Partnership (PWP)
- Community Integration is a veteran focused, community led initiative to proactively connect with all veterans and ensure access to quality resources and opportunities available in collaboration with the community
- We aim to cultivate an integrated, resilient, and prosperous veteran community within the Permian Basin by improving veteran quality of life thus ending veteran suicide
- As of April 2023, the program is growing veteran outreach into Southeastern New Mexico communities



## Flipped Energy Internships

- The Flipped Energy two-week summer internship provided a relevant, hands-on work experience and exposure to Energy industry related careers for 15 high school students from Jal, Carlsbad, Hobbs, Lovington, and Dexter
- Beginning on June 12<sup>th</sup>, students were housed for their two-week program at New Mexico Junior College in Hobbs
- The program began with an introduction to Oil & Gas and covered topics like sustainability, automation, drilling, safety, and drone usage
- Now in its second year, the program uniquely brought together multiple energy companies and experts to share industry information with students
- This innovative internship model solves the industry's central issue engaging young people
- By relieving the potential liability of having multiple students on any given site, potential regional employers can still provide students with robust learning experiences in a low-risk environment
