Projects Funded 194 (For the period of July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024)

The New Mexico Crime Victims Reparation Commission administers its federal and state funds to support survivors services through a comprehensive statewide plan that outlines funding priorities and strategies to enhance responses to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, homicide victims and victims of crime throughout New Mexico. This comprehensive plan is developed in collaboration with all victim services stakeholders and providers throughout New Mexico to ensure it addresses the needs of crime victims in New Mexico.

Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Assistance Grant Funds \$9,086,144.00

The primary purpose of the Victim of Crime Act Assistance (VOCA) grant is to provide direct services to victims of crime throughout the state. These funds provide services to victims of crime, responding to their emotional and physical needs, assisting them in stabilizing their lives, guiding them through the criminal justice system, and providing them with safety and security. The funding is available to state agencies, local governments, non-profit agencies, Native American tribal governments, hospitals that offer crisis counseling, support groups or other types of victim services. These funds supported **76** projects and **21,159 victims/survivors/clients** in New Mexico.

Sexual Assault Service Program (SASP) Grant Funds \$566,783.00

The purpose of the Sexual Assault Service Program (SASP) is to promote the development, throughout the state, of locally based and supported nonprofit programs for the survivors of sexual assault by standardizing the quality of services provided. This funding supports intervention, advocacy, accompaniment, support services, and related assistance impacting adult, youth, and child victims of sexual assault, family and household members of victims and those collaterally affected by the victimization in New Mexico. These funds supported **14 projects** across New Mexico.

STOP Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant Funds \$1,234,598.00

The purpose of the STOP Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) funds is to support communities in their efforts to develop and strengthen effective law enforcement and prosecution strategies to combat violent crimes against women, and to develop and strengthen victim services in cases involving domestic, sexual, staking and dating violence. These funds supported **31 projects** that provided direct services to **7,068 victims/survivors/clients** in New Mexico.

State Funding for Victim Service Providers \$11,131,525.00

The purpose of the state funds is to support law enforcement victim advocates, civil legal assistance, human trafficking, missing persons, victim rights, guardianship and emergency assistance funding to crime victims. In addition, these funds support infrastructure and core services for sexual assault services and the New Mexico Intimate Partner Death Review Team. The State Services Funding supported **73 projects** and assisted **19,752 victims/survivors/clients** in New Mexico.
