Preview of Special, Supplemental, and Deficiency Requests

Overview

- For the 2025 legislative session, agencies continued the recent trend of large special, supplemental, and deficiency appropriation requests.
- Requests totaled \$2.717 billion, including \$2.674 billion from the general fund, \$35.5 million from other state funds, \$750 thousand in interagency transfers, and \$6.5 million in federal funds.
- These amounts do not include public school requests but does include colleges and universities. This reflects a year-over-year increase of \$519.5 million, or 23 percent from the amount requested in 2024.
- Although the total amount requested has increased, year-over-year the number of requests was down slightly, largely due to a number of very large requests.



Special, Supplemental, and Deficiency Appropriations | October 24, 2024

- Changes to budget submission instructions from the Department of Finance and Administration have moved up the date for which special appropriation requests are due. However, some requests, notably for public schools are still pending.
 - In 2024, requests for public schools totaled \$635 million, however, it is unclear what the total will be for 2025.
 - Further, some supplemental and deficiency appropriations from state agencies might not yet be submitted.

Agency Requests

• Several agencies had large requests with five agencies submitting seven requests of more than \$100 million. Both the Transportation and Environment Department submitted multiple \$100 million requests.

- Common areas across agencies included the following:
 - Information technology requests: at least \$55 million not including large requests from the Department of Information technology for cybersecurity, broadband, and for large IT systems through the C-2 process.
 - Vehicles: At least \$7.8 million, mostly for the General Services Department, which manages the state fleet. Several agencies request capital outlay dollars for vehicles as well, including both GSD and the Energy, Minerals, and Natural Resources Department. The Department of Public Safety requested \$17.9 million in capital outlay dollars for vehicle purchases, but did not request a special appropriation for vehicles.

- Marketing and promotion: At least \$23 million, mostly at the Tourism Department.
- Personnel costs: \$17.6 million for state agencies, including \$5.5 million for FY25.
 - Some agencies indicate they have overspent their current year operating budget, including the Developmental Disabilities Council. Others, such as the Department of Information Technology, looking to hire additional staff in the current year, while others, such as the Ethics Commission requested a special appropriation to pay staff in FY26, assuming the Legislature will likely not fully fund its recurring operating budget request (the agency requested 19 percent for personnel, but the special appropriation request assumes they receive 3 percent).
- Many agencies also requested special appropriations for facilities improvements, some of which may be duplicated by capital outlay requests. Notable facilities requests include \$25.2 million for judicial facilities, and \$1.5 million for the Department of Health.
