MISSION

To regulate Nursing Home Administrators in a manner that ensures public safety by:

- Ensuring appropriate licensure requirements for Nursing Home Administrators
- Qualifying candidates for licensure and recommending candidates to sit for the national exam (confirming competency)
- Establishing and enforcing the laws and regulations that govern the practice of nursing home administrators
- Requiring that any person responsible for planning, organizing, directing, and controlling the operation of a nursing home be licensed
- Providing effective means for resolving consumer

PURPOSE

The Nursing Home Administrator Board is created to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public by providing laws and regulations to govern the practice of nursing home administration and protect the citizens of New Mexico from unprofessional, unscrupulous, or incompetent nursing home facility administrators. Section 61-13-5, NMSA 1978





KEY FUNCTIONS

The Board of Nursing Home Administrators maintains a vital and ongoing role in regulating the nursing home administration within our state. Nursing Home Administration involves the planning, organizing, directing, and controlling of nursing home operations. Without these regulatory functions, there could be a loss of competent oversight and management of nursing homes, which provide essential care to some of the state's most vulnerable residents.
