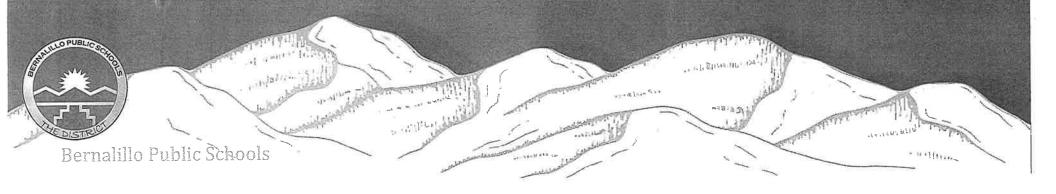
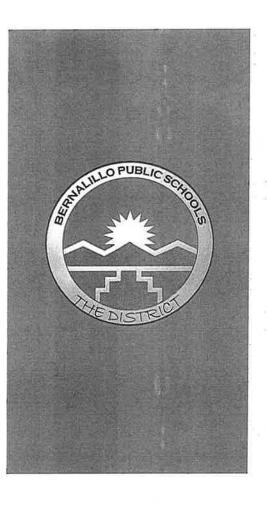

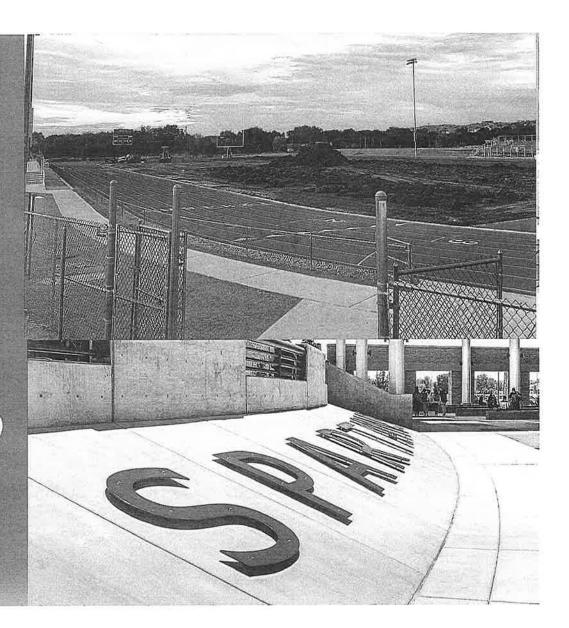

### John Hattie on Planning and Assessing

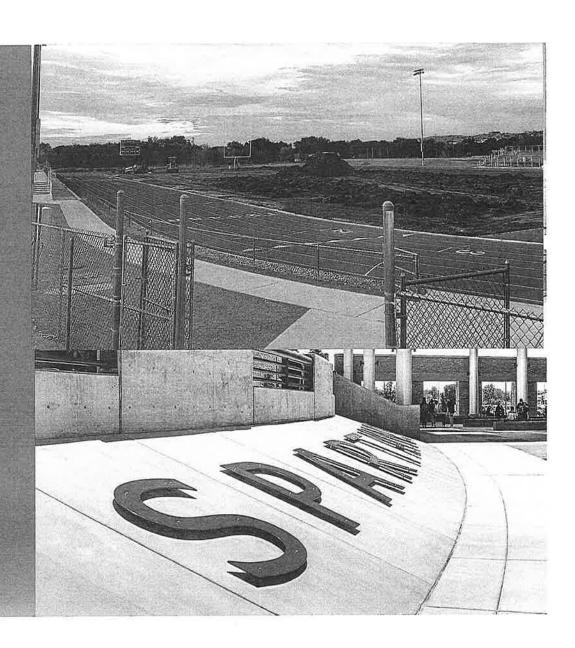
"There are two parts in targeted learning: the first is being clear about what is being learned from the lesson(s) (the learning objective); the second is having a way of knowing that the desired learning has been achieved (the success criteria).

Targeted learning involves the teacher knowing where he or she is going with the lesson and ensuring that the students know where they are going. These pathways must be transparent to the student. Such teacher clarity is essential, and by this I mean clarity by the teacher to the students. Teachers need to know how to keep all of the class on track for the learning goal and then evaluate their success in moving all to the goal."

## **Planning Sequence**

- Identify the highest leverage <u>action step</u> and write a clean, clear "what" and "how"
- Plan the **Do It** what practice does the teacher need to do to master the action step?
- Plan the <u>See It</u> what does the teacher need to see to have clarity about the action step when done well?
- Plan the <u>Name It</u> what will you ask to have the teacher articulate and internalize the action step?

## **Action Steps Drive the Coaching Conversation**

#### SEETT

(Unpack a model to identify the HOW of the Action Step)

NAMEIT

(Clear WHAT and HOW Action Step)

DOIT

(Practice the HOW of the Action Step) Model should directly align with the Action Step — Coachee unpacks the HOW

of the action step in the debrief of the model

Practice should directly align with the Action Step — Coachee practices the HOW of the action step

We seek feedback on our work and are vulnerable in identifying and closing our gaps.

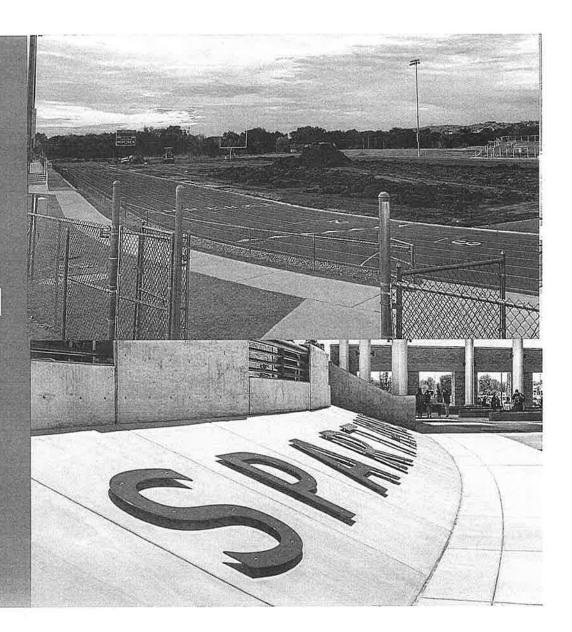
