

2024-2025 HIGHLIGHTS

Early Intervention and Developmental Specialists Department (Ages 0-6):



- Provided direct services to 247 families through 4,243 home visits.
 - Ongoing consultation to an additional 112 families.
- Provided training to across the state including ECECD's Head Stat providers.
- Implementation of statewide tele-audiology program made possible by various local and state partnerships as well as the support of RPSP funding.

Statewide Educational Outreach (Services to K-12 Districts/Schools/Families)



- Provided Educational Consultation, ASL Services, Interpreting Mentoring, Speech-Language Consultation, and Diagnostician Consultation statewide.
- Reinstated Family to Family Events in various locations.
- Provided 15 statewide/district-wide training sessions.
- Provided ASL classes and re-started in-person ASL immersion programs.

Site-Based Instructional Programs

- 210 children received full time direct instruction from NMSD's site-based programs.
- At least 90% of high school students participated in clubs, athletics, and student organizations.
- 6000+ hours of related and support services were provided to at least 85% of students.
- Student Life hosted in-person summer camps for students.
- Students participated in employment opportunities through partnerships with Assistance Dogs of the West and Rocky Mountain Youth Corps
- Middle School Robotics State Champions!
- Football and Volleyball made it to the State tournaments/playoffs.
- Girls' Basketball won the championships at an 8-state regional tournament for the first time since NMSD joined in 2007.
- Qualified for and competed in national competitions against much larger schools (4x-5x the size of NMSD) in large states.

Capital Outlay Projects

- Current: Albuquerque Preschool (\$4.4 million through Capital Outlay. Remaining through PSFA/PSCOC)
- New: Dillon Hall Building Envelope/HVAC (\$6.4 million through HED Capital Outlay)
- James A. Little Theater A/V and accessibility/ADA upgrades (\$1.5 million. Exploring funding sources)

Funding Notes

- We are aware of two possible significant budgetary considerations:
 - There is a request in place to increase educator salaries by 3%. Our estimates would need to adjust accordingly.
 - If there is an increase in how health insurance costs are allocated and expected increases in school support (for an 80/20 match), this will significantly impact our budget by about \$650,000. We request careful consideration for this as well.
- We also put in an RPSP request for an activity bus for our students at \$330,000. We need to find funding for this as well.
- NMSD receives a total of \$941,000 in restricted funds. It remains unclear whether our services supported by Medicaid funding would be impacted by general cuts. Our projections assume no changes.
- NMSD holds an average I&G cash balance of \$5,800,000 (Approximately 25%). Recommendation is 14 weeks or closer to 30% of operating expenses in cash balance.
