




### Visualizing Site Readiness





**EDD's Site Readiness Site** 





\$2M - for recruitment efforts with NM Partnership



### **Outdoor Recreation Division**



- Outdoor Equity Fund \$2.18M awarded; 140 apps requesting \$4.9M; LOE funds fully expended; since FY21: \$8.7M invested, 106K+ youth reached
- Trails+ Grant \$5.23M to 25 projects (82 jobs); demand up 50%; since FY21: \$33.8M invested, 2,314 jobs, 244 projects statewide
- Leveraged Investment \$35.5M leveraged through Trails+ and \$9M through OEF, delivering strong 1:1+ impact.
- Tribal Engagement 17 Tribal projects in FY26 supporting youth programs and infrastructure
- Business & Public Support Updated NMOutside.com; ActivatOR accelerator (17 businesses); Adventure Pitch Fest with 8 finalists



### New Mexico Film Office






- Economic Impact Nearly \$1B annually and 8,000 jobs over the past 5 years
- FY26 YTD: \$214M production spend →
   \$348M economic impact
- 126K worker days; 1,390 NM crew hires; 4,264 NM talent hires
- Median wages: Crew \$35.22/hr;
   Performing Artists \$75.21/hr;
   Background \$17.24/hr
- Rural Impact \$11.2M rural spend FY26 YTD
- Production Activity 6 series, 16 features, 3 commercials, 3 emerging media projects, 1 documentary, 2 shorts in pipeline.

### **Creative Industries Division**



- Arts & Cultural Districts Pilot \$925K for 10 districts to support placemaking, adaptive reuse, and creative activation
- Folk Arts Apprenticeship \$33K to support 12 apprentice/master pairs; exploring DWS workforce pathways
- Support Organization Grant 102 applicants requesting \$5.2M, exceeding the \$4M FY26 allocation.
- NM CreativeCon (2026) Statewide convenings to strengthen the creative business ecosystem with broad state and local partners.



### Mainstreet / Food and Hunger



#### **Mainstreet**

Alamogordo Great Blocks on Main Street - \$2.9M in EDD/NMMS capital outlay to transform main corridor into a vibrant, accessible downtown destination



### **Food and Hunger**

Expanded Access to Capital – Current cycle received a record 132 applications demonstrating strong statewide need and demand for FHA services

Statewide Food Retail Community of Practice – established 1<sup>st</sup> of its kind collaborate network supporting small local retailers, Tribal food stores, coop grocers, and distributors with shared learning and problem-solving.

### **Spaceport**

Economic Impact – Published economic impact report showing 313 direct jobs and 790 total jobs supported throughout the state, \$240M contributed to economic output





### **Military Base Planning**

Reestablished fully-staffed, physical office brought Military Base Planning Commission and Office into compliance, establishing first online presence in 25+ year history

### Border Authority / JEDI



### **Border Authority**

Advanced over \$50 million in infrastructure projects and planning studies; provided strategic support to **Project Jupiter,** helping land a high-impact investment in New Mexico's border region



### Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (JEDI)

Small Business Support – launched Capital Connect, providing bilingual financial counselling and loan assistance to first time entrepreneurs
