The request reflects a 4.7% overall increase including an additional \$43.1 million of General Fund which includes funding for:

- Replacement of expired federal grants
- Replacement of exhausted fund balances
- Expansion of continuum sites in additional communities
- Expansion of services for community-based alternative to detention
- Increased operational costs for rent and fixed rates

FY27 Budget Request - GRO



Includes a **Governmental Result and Opportunity (GRO)** funding request for **\$61.3 million** which includes funding for:

- Positions in Protective Services \$14.8M
 - ✓ To meet Kevin S. caseload standards and comply with Remedial Order #2
- Juvenile Justice Positions \$9.5M
 - ✓ Correctional Officer Positions in the Facilities to support increased population
 - ✓ Probation Officer Positions in the Field to support increased referrals
- Client clothing, meals, hygiene products, linens, medical care, supplies, and medications to meet basic needs \$5.9M
 - ✓ For increased population in facilities
- Additional Behavioral Health Programs \$1.5M
 - ✓ To address increased substance use and infant mental health challenges.
- Positions in Program Support \$5.0M
 - ✓ To support our programs with contractual, financial, technological and legal needs



CYFD Workforce



- CYFD has 2,429 Full Time Employees
- Vacancy rate in September was 29% and was 27% as of December 5, 2025
- CYFD currently has 379 positions posted.
 - 273 Protective Services and Family Services
 - 74 Program Support
 - 14 Juvenile Justice Services
 - 18 Behavioral Health Services
- CYFD has hired 563 new employees since January 1, 2025
- CYFD currently has 281 employees with a degree in social work.

Workforce Strike Force



To address CYFD's historical workforce challenges, the department has established a high-level, cross-agency **Workforce Strike Force** led by the **Chief Operating Officer**.

Early accomplishments:

- Identified opportunities to streamline the hiring pipeline process from 81 days to 45-50 days
- Investigative case closures over 2500 since September
- **Employee retention plan** is being finalized, with communications activities already starting and new employee onboarding strategies will start in January.
- Finalized plan for stay interviews to start in January

Kevin S.



The Kevin S. Settlement builds upon CYFD's commitment to create a child welfare system built on trauma responsiveness and improving the state's outcomes for children who touch the child welfare system.

- 2022 Final Settlement Agreement
 - ✓ Implementation Targets and Target Outcomes continue
- 2023 Memorandum of Understanding
 - ✓ Multiple required reports are delivered to Co-Neutrals and Plaintiffs regularly
- 2025 Remedial Order #1
 - ✓ Most requirements were not met timely resulting in Remedial Order #2
- 2025 Remedial Order #2
 - √ Status conferences held October 7 and December 1 with progress noted
- Pending
 - ✓ A hearing will be held in early 2026 to assess compliance with the Remedial Orders
