#### **New Mexico Meat and Poultry Products**

- A majority of animals are sold to buyers who export them from New Mexico.
- The animals then spend a period of time being fattened and prepared for slaughter, then slaughtered and processed at facilities in another state.
- The meat is then returned to New Mexico to be sold to New Mexico retailers and consumers.

## What are Ranchers Faced With in the COVID-19 Pandemic?

- Feedlots are full to capacity due to the fact that many slaughter facilities are reducing man power and/or closing due to the COVID-19 outbreak.
- This means that weaned calves are bringing approximately \$600.00 700.00 per head when in the past years they were bringing approximately \$900.00 \$1,000.00 per head.
- Ranchers are finding it difficult to even find a buyer who is willing to take their calves due to the lack of any wheat pasture or feeding facility to take them to.

# Federal Meat Inspection at Slaughter Facilities in New Mexico

- Federal Meat Inspection program has limited resource in regards to man power.
- There is limitation on the amount of meat that may be processed for intrastate and interstate retail sales and personal consumption.
- We have reports that many food sales occur without food safety inspections making the safety of the product questionable

#### Federal and State Cooperation

- Twenty-Seven States currently have their own meat and poultry inspection programs serving about 2,000 small or very small establishments.
- In approximately one-third of the states with inspection programs, the state inspectors provide inspection coverage for both federal and state facilities under a program known as Talmadge/Aiken Act (T/A).
- Nine of the current 28 states with inspection programs have cooperative T/A agreements with FSIS, covering a total of 307 federally inspected plants.
- The states run the programs cooperatively with FSIS, which provides <u>50</u> <u>percent</u> of the funds for operating them through a reimbursement program.

### Potential for the New Mexico Economy

- Additional jobs to New Mexico's workforce.
- Potential for new agricultural businesses.
- Expansion of New Mexico resources for farmers to sell products to.
- Funds generated in New Mexico will remain in New Mexico's rural economy.
- Safe meat products for New Mexican's to consume.
