- Isleta will continue to fight for the rights of its citizens to vote and be represented by a candidate of our choice



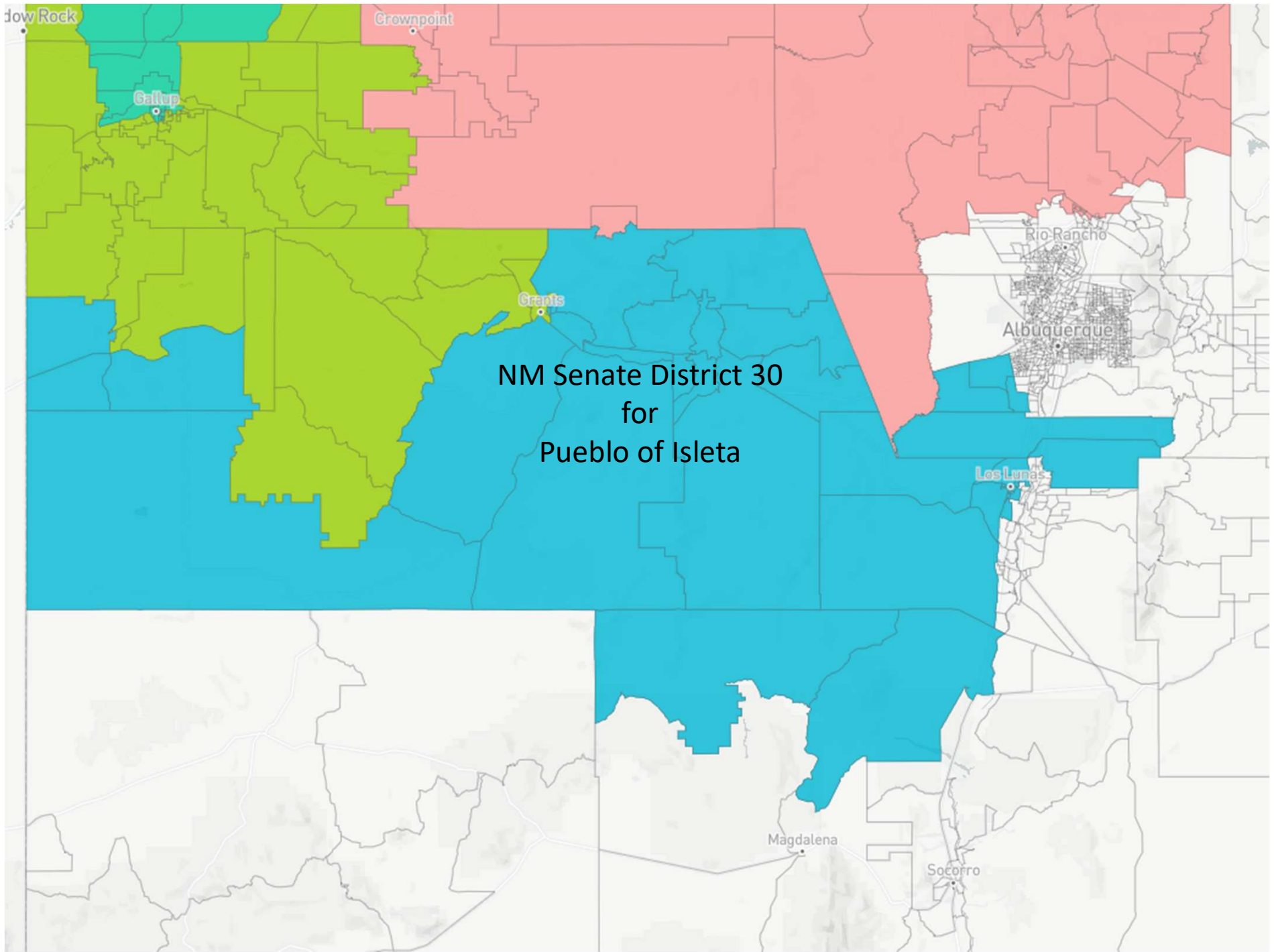

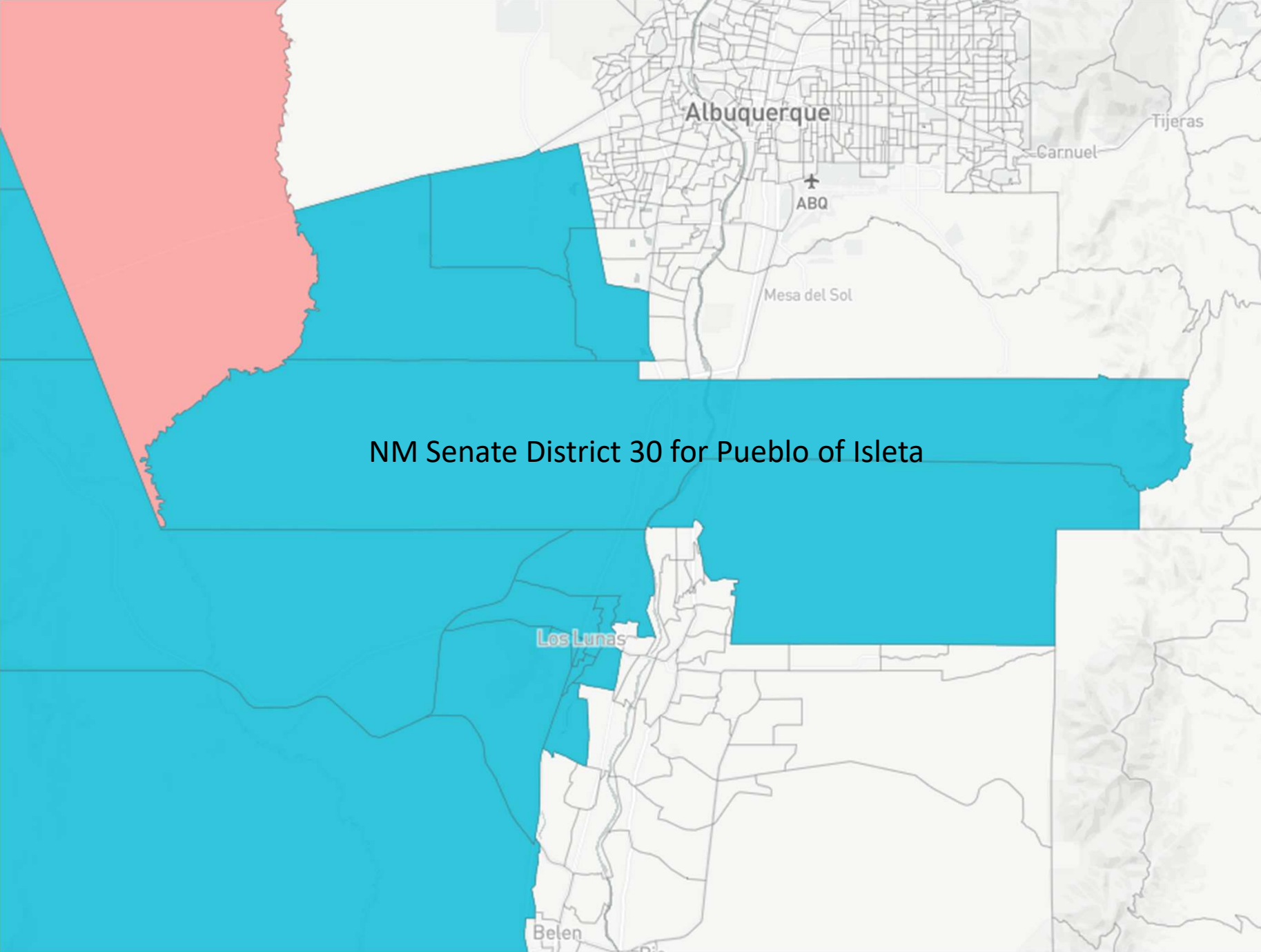
State Re-districting and reapportionment of State House, Senate and Congressional Districts of New Mexico

NM Senate District 30 for Pueblo of Isleta

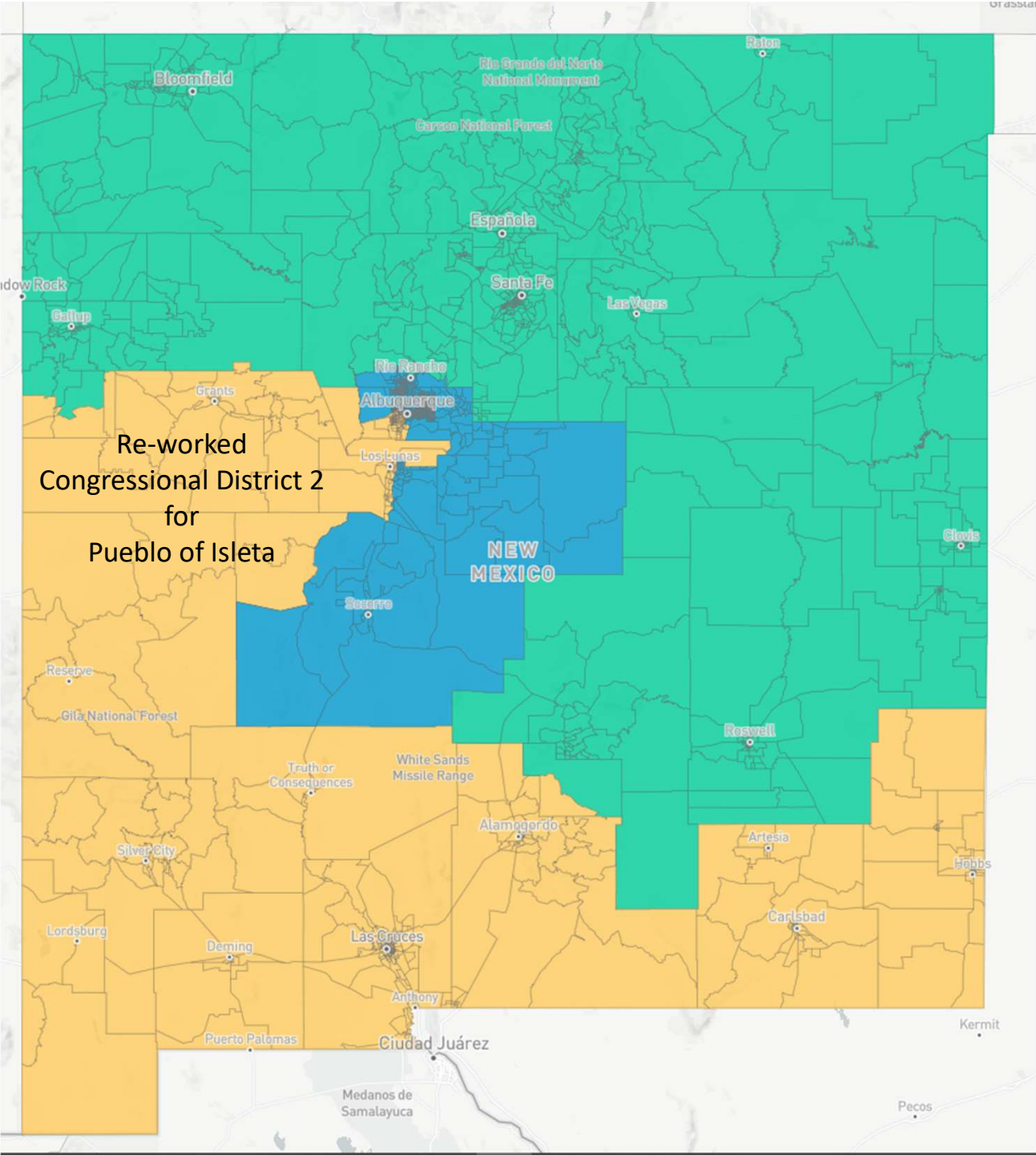


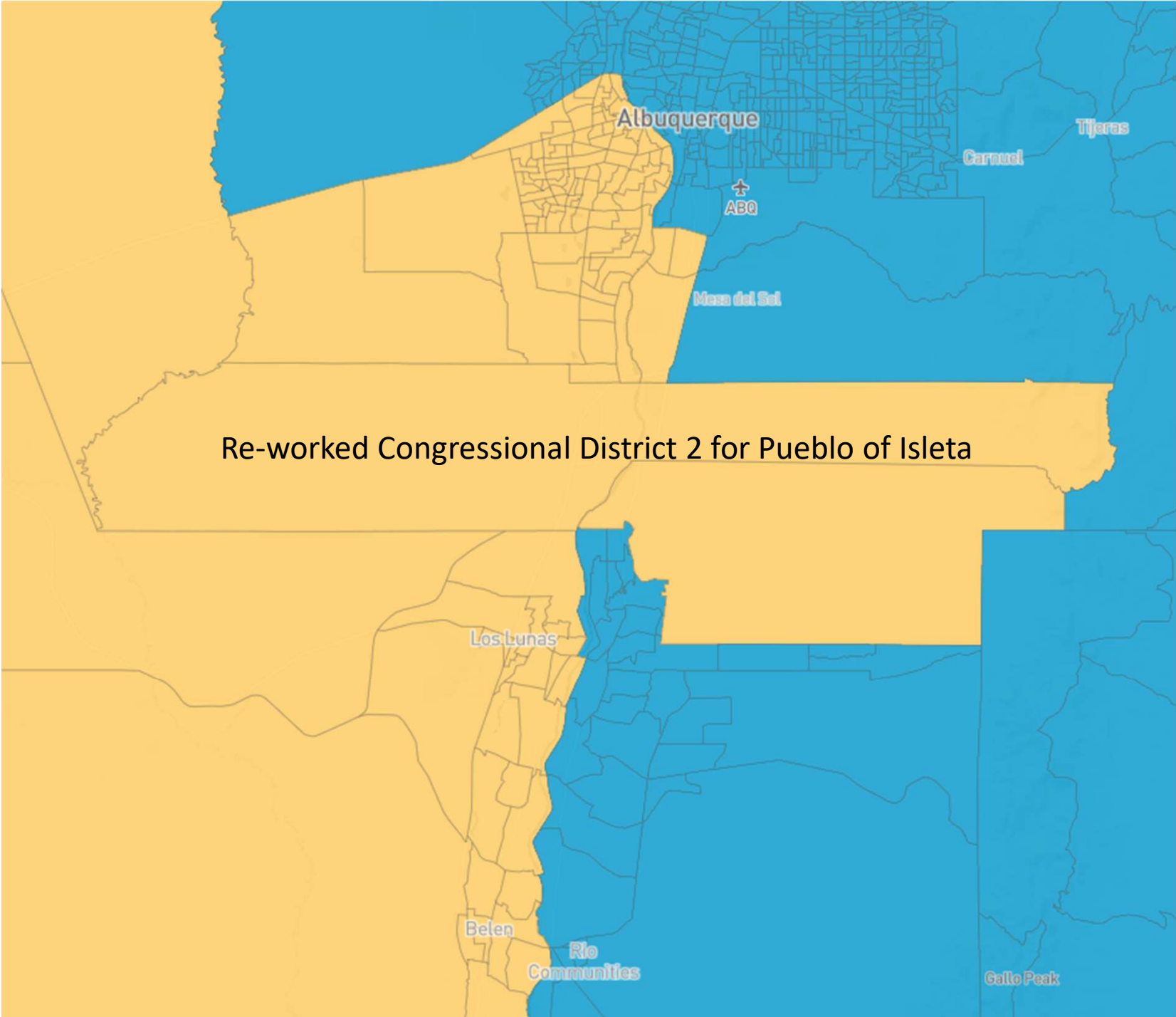
