Growth of Heath Related Research at UNM HSC: Responding to the current & emerging health care needs of New Mexico and workforce of the future



- Growth due to tactical success (portfolio diversification; new teams)
- Funded by federal government, private foundations and private companies
- Other universities have not been able to match growth
- Important as part of the higher education funding formula



Research Signature Programs

- Disease focus (not just "capacities" or "capabilities")
- Inter-disciplinary, spanning SOM Departments and HSC Colleges and the UNM campus
- Promoting formation of new teams to address key problems in health care
 - 7 to 38 Large Collaborative Grants (NIH U and P Series)
- Bench → Bedside → Community








Continuum of Care






The ECHO Model – Sanjeev Arora, MD





United States Hubs and Superhubs



Ziedonis program of research on co-occurring mental illness and addiction, including tobacco and wellness

Primary Topics:

- Tobacco Addiction
- Opioids/Cocaine with Depression/Schizophrenia including diverse populations
- COD Recovery Oriented & Wellness Psychosocial Interventions
 - Open Dialogue, Dual Recovery Therapy, and Mindfulness

Primary Methodologies:

Mixed Methods, Clinical Trials, Behavioral Therapy Development, and D&I

Grant Productivity: 120 research grants since 1993

- 29 as PI, 68 as Co-I, 17 NIH/other career awards, and 2 Center Grants
- 328 original research articles, including clinical practice guidelines, behavioral therapy & organizational change manuals, and a CD, computer programs, videos, etc.
- 2 NREPP SAMHSA programs (MISSION & Open Dialogue)
