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# The Role of Planned Parenthood in treating NM patients

- PPRM-NM is an important partner in the NM healthcare system
  - 3 clinics, telehealth, texting, education, community outreach
- In 2020, PPRM-NM provided:
  - 14,177 health center visits
  - 4,516 Medicaid patients
  - 17,077 STI tests
  - 2,447 HIV tests
  - 72 PEP & PrEP
  - 32 STI testing telehealth visits



# STIs rates are increasing in NM and across the US

### STIs are increasing across the US, including NM

- **CHLAMYDIA:** NM in 10<sup>th</sup> highest state rates
- GONORRHEA: NM is 11<sup>th</sup> highest n the
  US
- SYPHILIS: Most dramatic increase of STIs
  - NM, 2<sup>nd</sup> in the US (26 cases in 2019)



#### PPRM value: Meet the patient where they are

- PPRM NM values meeting the patient where they are:
  - Geographically, using mail in kits & telehealth
    - Mail-in STI testing started 2021) for gonorrhea and chlamydia
    - Testing kit mailed directly to patients to take in the comfort of their home
    - Mailed back and patient gets results in 7 days
    - Telehealth STI visits started in 2020
  - Respecting the patient's gender identity:
    - She/her, he/him, they/them
    - Penis, vagina rather than gendered terms
  - Using words that are meaningful to the patient
    - Using STI instead of STD



#### **PPRM Value: Empower the** patient to understand their health and make the decision that's right for them

- Mpower: What it is & how it impacts STI & HIV education, treatment and diagnosis
  - NM Mpower is longest running program in US
- Mpower by the numbers:
  - HIV testing to 300 people
  - PEP and PREP services: 35 PEP 92 PrEP
  - Education/Prevention where patients are:

 LGBTQ community outreach at bars. community gatherings

# How New Mexico leaders and decision-makers Can Help

NM, and most states in the US, are grappling with dramatically increasing rates of STIs. The following measures would EXPAND access to STI prevention, diagnosis, and treatment:

- 1. State Grants to provider programs for:
  - pre-paid postage on the mailed STI testing kits, so neither the patient nor the provider is burdened with the \$15 cost per kit
  - Infrastructure to expand telehealth
  - Public awareness campaign PPRM as powerful communicator
  - Testing and treatment for uninsured people

#### 2. Medicaid reimbursement rates

 Increased "cassette" for Syphilis and HIV: finger prick blood test with immediate results
