

# **Food Insecurity**

- Food insecurity—the lack of access to sufficient, safe, and nutritious food
  - 17% of New Mexicans are food insecure
- Issue has been further exacerbated by the pandemic
  - Food scarcity
  - Farmers forced to plow under crop
- Inflation
  - Groceries and other foods prepared at home increased by 2.6%
    - Beef 14%
    - Pork 12.%
    - Poultry 6.6%


