Surveyed over 400 educators in Santa Fe Public Schools


Survey focused on three areas of concern to educators and community members:

Results tell us that all of these areas require action by our union, our district, and leaders in our Santa Fe community...


Affordable Housing and Student Homelessness

Do you live in the city of Santa Fe? 416 responses




If you wanted to buy a home (including condo or townhome) today in the city of Santa Fe that met your family's needs, could you afford it on your salary as an educator?


If you rent, have you experienced rent increases that created a financial hardship in the last five years?

211 responses




If you have rented in Santa Fe in the last ten years, have you had to move as a result of rising rent, foreclosure on the property or sale or conversion of the property by the landlord?




Are you concerned about your ability to continue to work in Santa Fe due to rising housing costs? 399 responses




Are you experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity now? 397 responses

Access to Affordable Child Care

Steps taken by educators to provide child care

Top answers:

Family member cares for children: 42%

Pay for center-based child care: 37%

Pay for home-based child care: 21%


Public school pre-K: 18%

Reduced hours or FTE to afford: 8%

Of educators who pay for child care, the **average monthly cost was \$954** with some reporting over \$2,000 per month


Have you ever needed to quit a job, decline a new job, or significantly change a job in order to accommodate the need to provide child care to a child?


Do you think Santa Fe Public Schools should offer a high quality child care program for the children of district employees?

Do you support tapping the state's permanent fund to provide a dedicated source of revenue for pre-k programs in New Mexico?




Have you seen limits placed on your work as an educator due to an over-emphasis on standardized testing or other mandated assessments in the district or within your school/site?


Do your students take standardized tests or do other mandated assessments that do not assist you in your work to help them learn?


Have you experienced an increase in uncompensated work time as an educator over the last five years?
