OSHA Standards – Medical Surveillance Requirements

Standard requirements may include some or all of the following:

- ✓ Pre-placement Exam
- ✓ Periodic Exam
- Emergency/ExposureExamination and Tests
- Termination Exam
- Examination IncludesSpecial Emphasis onSpecific Body Systems

- Work and Medical History
- Chest X-Ray
- Pulmonary Function Test (PFT)
- Other RequiredTests

- Evaluation of Ability to Wear a Respirator
- Additional Tests if Deemed Necessary
- Written Medical Opinion
- Employee Counseling
- Medical Removal Plan
