Easy Enrollment - Introduction

A simple solution to a persistent problem.

Current data estimates 214,000 New Mexicans are currently uninsured, and 113,000 people in our state have access to affordable health coverage but are not signing up.


> Easy Enrollment can reach this population.

Easy Enrollment - The Concept

Easy Enrollment uses the information provided on the income tax form to connect people with the insurance they qualify for.

With a simple check box releasing relevant information to the Health Insurance Exchange (beWellNM), tax filers will receive an eligibility assessment outlining what they qualify for and information on how to enroll.

Why the income tax system?

The income tax system:

-Reaches a large proportion of our target population
-About 60% of Medicaid-eligible adults, 70% of Medicaid-eligible children, 88% of those who qualify for discounts on the Exchange
-Provides most of the data needed to assess eligibility:
-Income level to verify eligibility threshold
-Social security numbers to verify citizenship

3 Easy Steps

Step 1: Check the Box

on the income tax form to indicate who is uninsured and release relevant information to NMHIX

Step 2: Eligibility Assessment for Exchange coverage and APTCs. If ineligible, they will be referred to HSD or NMMIP. More information may be required.

Step 3: Get Enrolled

into the appropriate coverage through a simplified process. For Marketplace coverage, NMHIX will open a special enrollment period.

Additions to Income Tax Form

NM Tax and Revenue will add several check boxes to the standard income tax form to ascertain:

- Who in the household is uninsured
- Consent to release relevant information for those marked uninsured
- Consent to automatically enroll into no-cost coverage if they qualify (optional)*

Eligibility Assessment

NMHIX receives the data and checks eligibility for coverage and APTCs If possibly eligible for Medicaid, the case will be referred to HSD If likely eligible for neither, tax filer will be referred to the New Mexico Medical Insurance Pool.

Sample Language for Tax Form

Please indicate who in your household is currently uninsured, if anyone:



Please use the information on this form to determine eligibility for Medicaid or other no-cost/discounted health coverage on the Exchange for anyone marked as 'uninsured'



If any of us marked as "uninsured" qualify for no-cost coverage, please automatically enroll the eligible individual(s) into that coverage*

Early Success in Maryland

- About 60,600 tax filers checked the box to request information in the first phase
- About 9,100 applied and 4,000 enrolled
 - 3,000 enrolled in Medicaid and 1,000 in Exchange
 - coverage (about 850 with APTCs)
- Numbers are likely to be higher in coming years after the pandemic and with all phases in place

Joint Chairman's Report: Impact of Maryland Easy Enrollment Health Insurance Program-Maryland Health Benefit Exchange

Projected Impact in New Mexico

- 214,000 uninsured in New Mexico
- 57,000 (27%) e ligible for Medicaid or CHIP
- 56,000 (26%) eligible for discounts on the Exchange
- 17% interest among uninsured in Maryland

Assuming same rate of interest in NM, we can expect at least 36,000 to check the box, and likely more.

Projected Impact In New Mexico

Cost-effective

Easy implementation, high return on investment

Rounds out our efforts Affordability is often our focus, but Easy Enrollment engages those that already qualify for affordable coverage
