Freight Rail Line to San Juan County

- Largest Metropolitan Statistical Area without a freight line in the country
- San Juan County and the Navajo Nation entered into an Historic MOU in Feb 2020
 - \$2 million BUILD grant
 - Planning and design of 100 mile freight rail expansion from I-40 corridor to San Juan County
 - Estimated construction cost- \$250-350 million
- Benefit oil and gas industry
 - Reduce traffic congestion, improve safety
 - Reduce lifecycle road costs
 - Lower transportation costs
 - Lower carbon footprint





Figure 2 General Study Area
