Veterans' Services Department (VSD) Update (1:09 p.m.)

Sonya L. Smith, secretary, VSD, gave committee members updates on the department and the proposed closure of four community-based outpatient clinics in New Mexico. She also discussed a proposal to move posttraumatic stress disorder services from New Mexico to Arizona. Secretary Smith said that the New Mexico Women Veterans Conference will take place in June and that United States Secretary of Veterans Affairs, Denis McDonough, will visit New Mexico on June 27-28, 2022.

Office of Military Base Planning and Support Update (2:42 p.m.)

Dorella Molina, chief financial officer, Office of Military Base Planning and Support, Economic Development Department, told committee members that the director's position at the office has been vacant for the past nine months. However, she noted that there are two contracts in motion: one for a centralized website and the second for an economic impact study to be conducted by the University of New Mexico.
