ETA Displaced Worker Assistance

As the layoffs happened:

- Conducted multiple Rapid Response sessions and provided Job Search Assistance
- Worked with the employers to create a standardized process for Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims that does not require multiple verifications of the severance package, and make UI more accessible
- Created a "bridge program" to serve workers between the date of layoff and the next step in their career path


Phase I

- Direct assistance payments of \$40,000, 571 participants, 51 in "reserve"
- Individual meetings with each participant
- Connection to social services and WIOA




Displaced Worker Demographics

- 49.7% Native American
 - 97% Navajo
- 53% union members
- 25% retired





Workers' Locations




96% in San Juan County



Education Levels


Educational Attainment, Not Retired (Phase I data)




ETA Displaced Worker Assistance

Phase II Option	Wage Differential	Direct Training	Apprenticeship
One-Time Payment	\$20,000	None	None
Living Stipend	None	\$2,000 per month up to \$36,000	\$2,000 per month up to \$36,000
Training Costs	None	Actual costs up to \$30,000	Actual costs up to \$24,000
Benefits to Employer	None	None	Reimbursement for ½ of base wages for up to 12 months




Wage Differentials

WIOA Reauthorization Concerns

- Crippling impact of limitations on administrative costs
- Pitfalls of data sharing
- Uneven treatment of Section 166 and Section 477 programs
- Any changes to Section 166 should be made in full consultation with the tribal programs themselves and should reflect the needs of the sovereign nations and their members
