Motions to Send Letters (10:58 a.m.)

On a motion made by Representative Chávez, seconded by Representative Herndon and objected to by Senator Scott, the committee voted to send a letter to the state's congressional delegation to express opposition to the proposed 10-year moratorium on state artificial intelligence legislation that is being considered as part of a congressional budget reconciliation bill. On a motion made by Senator López and seconded by Representative Chávez, and without objection, the committee voted to send a letter to the Health Care Authority to express concern regarding how appropriations intended to provide raises to direct support professionals are being used.
