11 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR DRINKING WATER SYSTEM FINANCING.

12  
13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

14 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.--One million eight hundred  
15 thousand dollars (\$1,800,000) is appropriated from the public  
16 project revolving fund to the drinking water state revolving  
17 loan fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2019 and subsequent  
18 fiscal years to provide state matching funds for federal Safe  
19 Drinking Water Act projects and to carry out the purposes of  
20 the Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund Act. Any  
21 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a  
22 fiscal year shall not revert to the public project revolving  
23 fund.

24 SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the  
25 provisions of this act is July 1, 2018.

11 RELATING TO FINANCE; AUTHORIZING THE NEW MEXICO FINANCE  
12 AUTHORITY TO MAKE LOANS FOR PUBLIC PROJECTS FROM THE PUBLIC  
13 PROJECT REVOLVING FUND; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

14  
15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

16 SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF PROJECTS.--Pursuant to  
17 Section 6-21-6 NMSA 1978, the legislature authorizes the New  
18 Mexico finance authority to make loans from the public project  
19 revolving fund for public projects as defined in Section 6-21-3  
20 NMSA 1978. Pursuant to Section 6-21-6 NMSA 1978, loans of less  
21 than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) do not require specific  
22 authorization and need not be identified in this act.

23 Authorization is given to the New Mexico finance authority to  
24 make loans to the following qualified entities on terms and  
25 conditions established by the authority:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.--One million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) is appropriated from the public project revolving fund to the local government planning fund administered by the New Mexico finance authority for expenditure in fiscal year 2019 and subsequent fiscal years to make grants to qualified entities to evaluate and estimate the costs of implementing the most feasible alternatives for infrastructure, water or wastewater public projects or to develop water conservation plans, long-term master plans, economic development plans or energy audits and to pay the administrative costs of the local government planning program. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of

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1 a fiscal year shall not revert to the public project revolving  
2 fund.

3 SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the  
4 provisions of this act is July 1, 2018.
