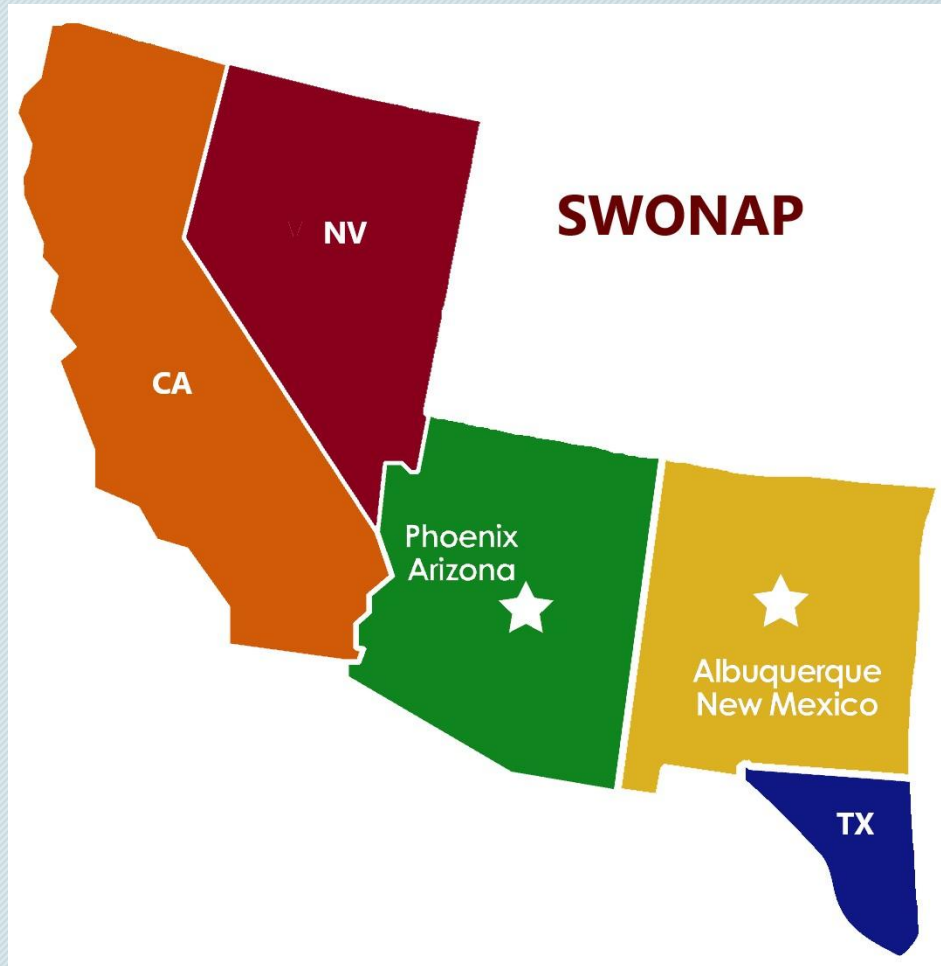
# SWONAP Update

## Office of Native American Programs

**Congress finalized the FY26 spending bill. The 2026 Budget appropriations for Native American Programs are the following:**

**\$1.375 billion** in funding allocated as follows:

- Indian Housing Block Grant for formula (IHBG): **\$1.1 billion**
- IHBG competitive grants: **\$125 million**
- Indian Community Development Block Grants (ICDBG): **\$ 100 million**
- Native Hawaiian Housing Block Grants: **\$21 million**
- Tribal HUD VASH: up to **\$7.5 million** for renewal grants
- Section 184: **\$1.5 million** in budget authority & **\$1.8** in loan limitation, no funding for administrative and contract expenses
- Section 184A : No budget authority & **\$28 million** in loan limitation

# 2025 Budget appropriations for Native American Programs continued

- Title VI: \$1 million in budget authority & \$50 million in loan limitation
- Training and Technical Assistance: \$7 million, of which \$2 million is reserved for NAIHC.
- Non-ONAP Programs Tribes are Eligible for:
  - CoC: \$3.544 billion
  - ROSS: \$40 million
  - PRICE: \$10 million
  - Choice Neighborhoods: \$75 million
  - Lead-Based Paint (\$200 million) and Healthy Homes (\$140 million) grants
