New Mexico has the fifth highest rate of poverty among people 65 years and older in the United State at 13.7%.

64,460 seniors (age 60+) in New Mexico received SNAP benefits in fiscal year (FY) 2022.

More than 31% of SNAP recipients (nttps://www.iiib.org/learin/iib. in New Mexico are in families with members who are older adults or are disabled.

New Mexico is ranked 3rd for older adults experiencing food insecurity. 46,163 or 18.4% are at risk of experiencing food insecurity or 1 in 5; 59,360 (10.7%) of Seniors or 1 in 9 are at risk of hunger.
