AWD Program Basics

Agricultural Workforce Development Act (2019)

- Must be agricultural business to apply
- NMDA pays up to 50% of actual cost of internship, including wages, worker's compensation, and directly related incidental costs
- Interns must be paid at least minimum wage
- Up to 3 interns/calendar year
- Interns must be 18 years or older and cannot be immediate family members or previous employees

NMDA Policies

- Applications considered on rolling first come, first served basis
- Limit of \$15k per intern




Program Growth

- Recurring Funding: \$125,000 (5% taken for admin.)
- In FY25, annual funding was fully allocated by July 30, 2024
- Interns are evaluated at end of internship and sometimes have been hired on afterwards as employees
- Common challenges: Finding, retaining and replacing interns



Bernalillo	Farm growing over 120 varieties of heirloom vegetables and fruits. Farm also has 100 laying hens for eggs, and keeps sheep,	
	goats, geese, and rabbits.	
Cibola	Ranch manages productive cattle herd while offering prime elk hunting opportunities.	
Curry	Ranch including cow/calf operation, yearlings on grass, and	
	irrigated corn farming.	
Doña Ana	Pecan farm. Internship included shelling and sales.	
Otero	Custom meat processing.	
Santa Fe	Farm, household and commercial composting facility.	
Valencia	Greenhouse/plant nursery.	



FY26 Application Cycle

- Now collecting applications through March 31, 2026 or until funding is fully allocated
- So far, NMDA has awarded 19 internships with over \$174k
