

Congratulations Class of 2024

- The Class of 2024 four-year cohort accomplished a 78.04 percent graduation rate a 1.34 percentage point increase from the prior year. This rate is both the highest graduation rate and the highest total number of graduating students in the last 15 years!
- Also noteworthy, career technical education (CTE) concentrators achieved a 95.77 percent overall graduation rate!
- Shout out to Roswell Early College High School for being among the Top 10, seeing a 96.52 percent graduation rate!



High School Graduation Strategies

Schools that achieved high graduation rates or made significant gains for Cohort 2024 shared several common strategies:

- Close monitoring of student course completion and credit accumulation
- Implementation of early warning systems to identify and support at-risk students
- Strategic planning through school improvement plans, which helped schools align resources and interventions to student needs
- Participation in Perkins and Nextgen CTE programs
- Ensuring that students set personal goals through their Next Step Plan prior to entering high school



NextStep Plans Level All Platform

Next Step Plans

- A Next Step Plan (NSP) is an interim plan, aligned to the graduate profile of the student's school district or charter school, that sets forth the coursework for the grades remaining until high school graduation. During senior year, the student will complete a final next-step plan prior to graduation.
- NSPs have been required for students in grades 8-12 since 2003.
- NSPs are spot-checked by bureaus during monitoring visits. The College and Career Readiness Bureau does this through Perkins Monitoring.
- Each school district and high school could have a unique NSP template, creating challenges when a student transfers.



The average New Mexico student spends approximately **31 minutes** exploring content in Level All **each month**. We expect this to fluctuate as the academic year goes on and students wrap up their NSPs.

What is a Graduate Profile?

- A Graduate Profile (sometimes referred to as Profile of a Graduate or Portrait of a Graduate) is a visualization of what a community believes their high school graduates need to know and demonstrate before they leave school.
- An LEA co-creates their graduate profile with input from key community
 partners, and uses the document to communicate the attitudes, skills and
 knowledge that are needed and valued for success in college, career and life.
- House Bill 171 requires all school districts and charter schools to create a unique graduate profile that articulates the core academic competencies and subjects that are key to graduates' post-high school success, and to which required units are aligned.
- Students' Next-Step Plans must be aligned with the district or charter school's graduate profile.

Graduate Profiles

Status of Graduate Profiles

 Advance CTE was awarded a multi-year contract to partner with CCRB in establishing a framework and guidelines, creating a written toolkit, providing technical assistance, and publishing all completed Graduate Profiles.

As of June 2025

- A draft of the Framework is complete. It includes an Introduction, minimum required elements, technical specifications, expectations for engaging partners, and guidance for implementing the profile after it is created.
- A landscape survey shows that we have copies of Graduate Profiles from 43 districts or charter schools; however, they have not yet been evaluated for their alignment with the new framework. 134 do not have (or have not submitted) a Graduate Profile.
- Focus groups were held on June 16 and 17 to solicit feedback about the elements needed in a toolkit.

COURSE WAIVERS

Any deviation from the prescribed graduation requirements must be approved by the PED via a coursework waiver. Graduation coursework waivers are obtained from the PED Waivers webpage and submitted to: Waivers.PED@ped.nm.gov

CTE/WBL CORE CREDIT

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn credit in the following courses with a passing grade of C or better:

English: English 1, English 2, and English 3; Math: Algebra 1 and Geometry or Integrated Math 1 and Integrated Math 2; Science: Two lab sciences. The CTE/WBL teacher of record must hold the proper licenses in the core content areas.

COHORT 2029 GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS (CONTINUED)

PATHWAYS

Standard Diploma Pathway

Traditional route for students who meet the general education requirements, including the completion of coursework and state assessments. Students with disabilities can participate in the Standard Diploma Pathway, but accommodations and modifications may be made to help them meet these requirements.

Ability Diploma Pathway

Specifically designed for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities by the student's IEP team. Students on the ability pathway take an alternative assessment in at least one subject. Guidance on the qualifiers eligibility for the ability pathway are detailed in the August 4, 2023, Memorandum regarding identification of students with the most significant cognitive disabilities.

NEXT STEP PLAN

On July 1, 2003, HB305 was signed into law, requiring high school students to create Next Step Plans, which set personal high school goals beginning in grade 8. The Next Step Plan shall be aligned to the graduate profile. The Final Next Step Plan is a mandatory prerequisite for graduation.

GRAD PROFILE

With the signing of HB171 into law, each school district or charter school shall create and use a graduate profile to specify the cognitive, personal, and interpersonal competencies that students should have when they graduate. The core academic competencies and subjects identified in a school district's or charter school's graduate profile shall align with required graduation units.

DOC

With the signing of HB171 into law, students no longer need to demonstrate competency (formerly known as DOC) in the five subject areas of mathematics, reading, writing, science, and social studies. However, per 6. 29.1 NMAC, General Provisions, a final examination shall be administered to all students in all courses offered for credit. Additionally, high school students are still required to participate in ESSA testing as assigned at grade 11 and grades 9-12 if identified as an English learner who has not met the state's exit criteria.
