Occupational wages are from the NMDWS Occupational Employment Statistics program. Projected annual openings are from the NMDWS Employment Projections program. Typical minimum education requirements and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) designations are based on information produced by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. In-demand and star designations are based on methodology created by NMDWS using projected job openings, growth rate, and wage data. Wage estimates are for 2017 and are rounded to the nearest \$10. The entry wage represents the mean of the lowest third of the wage distribution, with the experienced wage being the mean of the highest two-thirds of the distribution. Projected annual job openings are rounded to the nearest ten, with estimates under five reported as "<5". Occupations classified as "All Other" are excluded, as are occupations for which wage data are not able to be reported due to suppression requirements. Education levels represent the typical minimum education needed to enter the occupation, although higher levels of education may often be preferred.
