



GISD CTE OVERVIEW

- <u>Career and technical education</u> is the practice of teaching specific career skills to students in middle school, high school, and post-secondary institutions.
- CTE is made up of 16 career clusters which each related to careers in specific industries
- Overall, students who enter a CTE program are gaining knowledge and hands-on skill experience to prepare them for careers that they otherwise couldn't pursue.





Why CTE?

- CTE Students are more likely to graduate from High School and from Post-Secondary Education
 - The average high school graduation rate for students concentrating in CTE programs is 97.5 percent, compared to an average national freshman graduation rate of 80 percent.
 - o 91 percent of high school graduates who earned 2-3 CTE credits enrolled in college.

District- 42% CTE- 45.24%



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CTSO: Career and Technical Student organizations

- A career and technical student organization (CTSO) is an extracurricular group for students in CTE pathways to further their knowledge and skills by participating in activities, events, and competitions.
 - Local
 - State
 - National
- To be an authorized CTSO the organization must specifically relate to one or more of the 16 national career clusters.
 - o (Some CTSOs apply to more than one Cluster)
- Participation in CTSOs requires that students meet the same guidelines as those participating in Sports/Athletics (NMAA Guidelines)
- Being part of a CTSO can set students apart from those who aren't members.
 - o Resume building
 - Leadership

- Business Professionals of America (BPA)- AVECHS, CHS, GHS, STHS
 - o Is focused on providing student members with opportunities in leadership and citizenship while gaining academic and technological skills.



- o helps students develop college and career readiness skills. Specifically, DECA is focused on preparing students for careers in four clusters:

 - Finance
 - Hospitality & Tourism

 - o SkillsUSA is applicable for students in any career cluster or pathway.
- Technology Student Association (TSA) CHS, GHS, STHS
 - o is the only CTSO specifically focused on the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) career cluster.





What Can We Do?

- Pre-K 6th grade- Career Days, guest speakers, invite CTE Students to present at school or mentor students
- 7th-8th Grade- Career Exploration, Development of Next Step Plan, encourage students to take advanced courses
- 9th-12th Grade- Declare a program of Study
 - Complete 3-4 courses in a single CTE Pathway
 - o Gain Industry Certification
 - o Take Dual Credit Course in related Pathway
 - o Participate in a CTSO
