The Need for Homeless Assistance

- We estimate that a total of 15,000 to 20,000 experience homelessness in New Mexico each year. The pandemic has increased the number.
- While many people resolve their housing crisis on their own or with existing help, about 6,500 people per year do not and this number too will increase this year.




Homelessness and the Pandemic

- Most homeless people have not been infected thanks in part to isolation strategies
- This winter will be challenging since congregate shelter will be dangerous
- CARES Act funding can help with hotel programs
- Camping is increasing.

Youth Homelessness Demonstration

- \$3.37 Million HUD grant with \$413,000 State match to create system to house homeless youth in Northern New Mexico
- We assisted 89 homeless youths and their dependent children attain housing the first year in Northern New Mexico.
- Plan to expand to whole state



State Linkages and Supportive Housing

Started in 2007 as a pilot program and slowly grown.

\$4 million added in 2020 to about double this program

\$29.7 million per year estimated need for rental assistance and services (continue to seek federal, state and local funding to fill this gap)



Estimated Total State Cost to House All Homeless People in New Mexico

- \$61.3 million per year to provide rapid rehousing and permanent supportive housing, and oversight
- \$48 million one time capital investment
