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## New Mexico Office of the State Auditor

- The New Mexico Office of the State Auditor (OSA) is an independent agency that ensures public funds are used appropriately by overseeing audits of state and local governments.
- It conducts annual financial audits, special investigations, expanded special audits, and quality control reviews to enforce compliance with laws and professional standards.
- The OSA promotes transparency by analyzing and publishing audit reports, so the public stays informed.
- It has the legal authority to issue subpoenas in certain circumstances and report fraud, waste, and abuse.
- Overall, the OSA acts as a watchdog to protect taxpayers and build trust in government.



### How does OSA Help Small Local Public Bodies?

• Audit and compliance assistance:

The OSA helps acequias navigate their financial reporting requirements under the Audit Act by providing guidance on submitting tier certifications, assistance with agreed-upon procedures (AUPs), and audits, which many small acequias struggle to do on their own.

- Small Local Public Body (sLPB) Assistance Program: Through this program, the OSA offers dedicated support, training, and hands-on technical assistance to small public bodies to help them meet their audit and compliance obligations.
- Education and training:

The OSA conducts workshops and provides resources specifically tailored for small entities like acequias to improve understanding of financial management, record-keeping, and reporting.

• Connecting to approved auditors:

It helps acequias secure services from Independent Public Accountants (IPAs) familiar with acequia operations and has coordinated the grouping of smaller acequias together to reduce costs.

• Protecting funding:

By helping sLPBs complete required audits or AUPs, the OSA ensures they stay eligible for state or federal funding, which might otherwise be withheld due to noncompliance.





#### How the Small Local Public Body Assistance Program Helps Acequias

- Focused compliance support: Helps acequias complete required audits or agreed-upon procedures (AUPs) so they can comply with the Audit Act and maintain eligibility for state and federal funding.
- Hands-on technical help: Works directly with acequia officials to organize financial records, prepare tier certifications, and respond to audit findings.
- Cost-saving strategies: Group multiple acequias together under shared audit contracts to reduce costs and simplify the process.
- Tailored training and education: Provides workshops and one-on-one guidance to help acequias understand financial responsibilities, record-keeping, and reporting requirements.
- Protecting acequia infrastructure and funding: By ensuring compliance, the program safeguards acequias' access to critical funds for irrigation improvements, conservation projects, and long-term sustainability.





# Highlights of Direct Support for Acequias

- Withheld Funding: Acequias with \$1,388,046 in withheld public funds were assisted in achieving compliance with OSA.
- Direct Financial Assistance: 35 acequias received targeted support to complete agreed-upon procedures (AUPs) or tier certifications, helping them meet statutory audit requirements.
- Modernized Systems: The OSA revamped its OSA Connect platform, making it easier for acequias to submit financial documents and track compliance.
- Policy & Advocacy: Through the Small Local Public Body Forum, a dedicated work group is developing legislative proposals aimed at simplifying compliance and strengthening long-term support for acequias.
