








Figure 2: Life Expectancy from Birth in Doña Ana County by Small Area

Population Doña Ana County by Small Area, 2017






Figure 4: Age-adjusted death rate for the 10 leading causes of death in 2021: United States, 2020 and 2021




Figure 10: Years of Potential Life Lost in Doña Ana County by Cause of Death, 2013–2017. Data note: Causes of death are numbered according to their ranking in the state of New Mexico. The numeral "1" in front of Heart Disease indicates that it is the leading cause of death in the state.







Figure 5: Percent of Population Self-Reporting "Fair" or "Poor" Health, 2020

- Opened in July of 2021
- Licensed by DOH and reimbursed by Medicaid
- New Regulations allows better ED and jail diversion
- Part of Crisis Now Model
 - SAMHSA Best-practice
- Underutilized
 - Over 2,000 admissions
