



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Health Care Authority (HCA)

Amend the Health Purchasing Act - Clean up language

- references for HSD to HCA
- broaden the pool of public employees for group purchasing
- better value
- Health Information Sharing All Payer Claims Database





Health Care Affordability Fund (HCAF)

The purpose of the fund is to:

(1) reduce health care premiums and cost sharing for New Mexico residents who purchase health care coverage on the New Mexico health insurance exchange;

(2) reduce premiums for small businesses and their employees purchasing health care coverage in the fully insured small group market;

(3) provide resources for planning, design and implementation of health care coverage initiatives for uninsured New Mexico residents; and

(4) provide resources for administration of state health care coverage initiatives for uninsured New Mexico residents.

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Health Entity Mergers and Acquisitions

- Recent activity in health entity mergers and acquisitions has demonstrated the state does not have a role or authority for review, oversight, and approval.
- Other states have enacted legislation with authority to review, place conditions and potentially block mergers and acquisitions
- Consideration of cost, access, and equity
- Consumer and asset protection
- Require notice to the state



Hospital Provider Tax

- Leverage Medicaid funding to support hospital workforce and quality
- Recently revised CMS policies increase potential for new federal funding
- Historically, federal law has capped Medicaid Payments to hospitals at Medicare-equivalent rates
- CMS now allows directed payments up to the Average Commercial Rate
- Collaborating with the NM Hospital Association for program design and legislation
- Increase federal funding through hospital provider tax





Budget – Health Priorities

- Increase Medicaid provider rates to 150% of Medicare for Primary Care, Maternal/Child, and Behavioral Health - \$82 million GF
- Increase eligibility for Temporary Assistance for Need Families (TANF) from 85% to 95% federal poverty level - \$22.3 million GF
- Rural Health Care Delivery Fund \$120 million
- Nursing expansion and recruitment \$10 million
- Nurse preceptor program \$2 million

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Health Professional Loan Repayment Program - \$20 million



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
