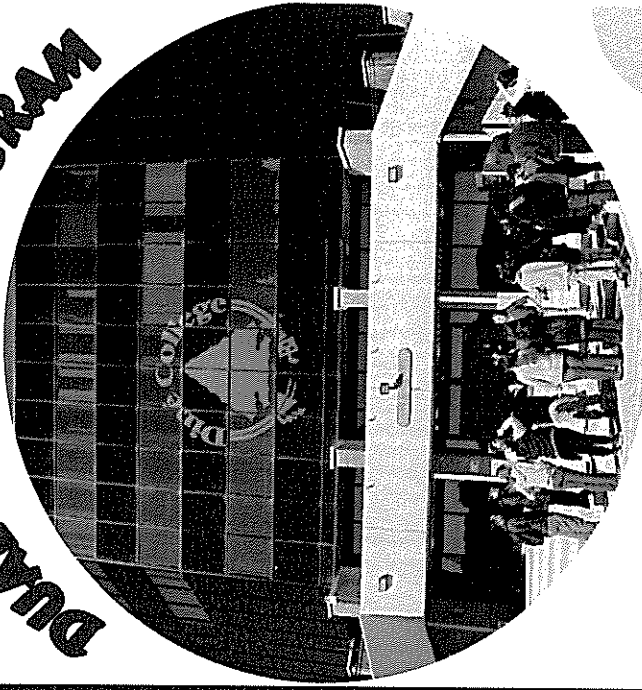
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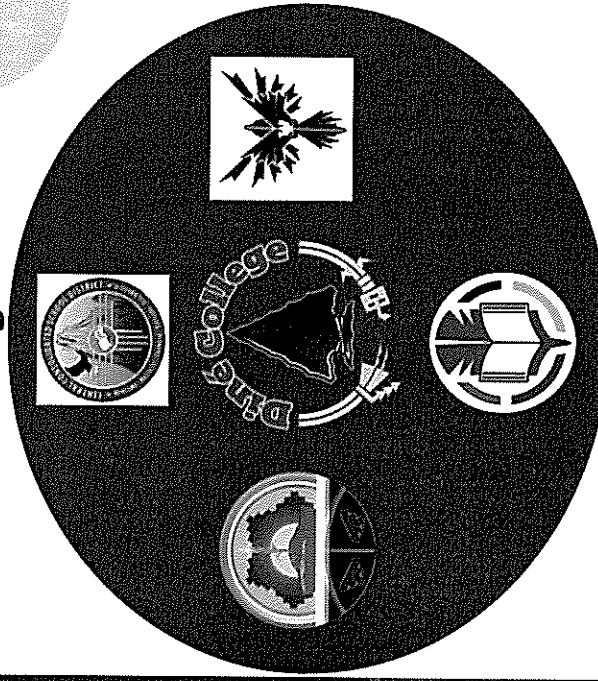

Dual Credit Program's Vision Statement

Diné College believes the Dual Credit Program will become a stepping-stone from high school to college, by serving as a pathway to academic-degree programs or college-level courses.

What is Dual Credit?

High school students have the opportunity to earn college credits while still in school, giving them a head start on their college education.

Diné College offers a variety of courses, including English, Math, and Navajo Language.

Each college course typically carries 3 to 4 credit hours, while high school classes earn 0.5 credits per semester.

Who can take Dual Credit?

Mexico state legislation permits Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors who meet the following requirements to apply:

- A minimum GPA of 2.0
- Approval from a counselor or principal
- Must be enrolled as a full-time high school student
- Parental or guardian approval

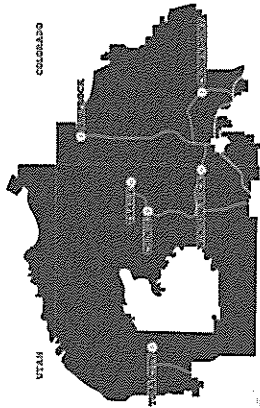

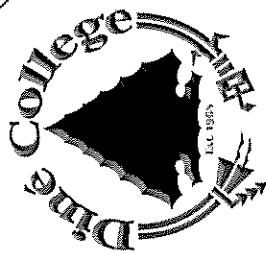

ABOUT DINÉ COLLEGE

Diné College was founded in 1968 as the first tribal college (TCU) in the United States. Diné College is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (hlc.commission.org), a regional accreditation agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. Located in Arizona and New Mexico on the Navajo Nation, Diné College predominately serves Navajo students (92%). The college is a four-year institution and offers 11 bachelor's degrees, 19 associate's degrees and 8 certificates. The main campus in Tsaiile has student dormitories and a cafeteria. The school participates in athletic competitions in rodeo, archery and cross-country. The school is governed by a eight-member Board of Regents.

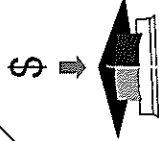

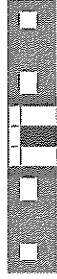

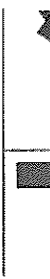
