State Land Office Legal Framework

- Broad authority over the management and disposition of state trust lands (9 million acres of surface, 13 million acres of mineral rights)
- Leases (ag, commercial, oil & gas, renewable, mining, etc.)
 provide terms and conditions entities must follow (including clean-up requirements)
- Leases also require compliance with other state and federal laws/regs (e.g., EMNRD, Environment Department, PRC, EPA)
- Enforcement tools achieve compliance via collaboration or litigation




Holtec Status Update


- NRC issued license to Holtec on May 9, 2023 for "interim" storage (10,000 casks of highlevel nuclear waste)
- NMSLO owns/leases mineral rights at site (no current restriction on leasing activities)
- EIS included faulty environmental & safety assessments; relied on misleading applicant info; failed to properly consider NMSLO mineral interests
- 5th Circuit Court of Appeals vacated Holtec's NRC license for NM storage site (March 27, 2024); possible U.S. Supreme Court review



Spent Nuclear Fuel Amounts Currently Stored at 70 Sites in 35 States




Oil & Gas Wells Within and Surrounding Project Area

Created New Environmental Compliance Office

- Secured three new Environmental Specialist positions in 2022 Legislative Session
- Stepped-up remediation & reclamation expertise & activities



Enforcement and Accountability Program


- 463 oil & gas wells plugged
- At least \$46 million in remediation costs NOT shouldered by taxpayers
- 30 lawsuits filed



Bonding

- Ensure all leases are bonded
- Protect taxpayers and land trust beneficiaries

Sanmal Queen Unit: Smith & Marrs / MMCP Leasing Lawsuit




Uranium Activity on State Trust Lands

- Two active, legacy uranium mining leases (neither producing)
 - NuFuels, Inc. (signed 2018; expires 2033)
 - Roco Hondo Resources, LLC (signed 2015; expires 2030)
- Major site contamination (San Mateo Creek Basin)
- Collaborating with NMED, EMNRD on legacy mine inventory and clean-up
