Military Retiree Tax Exemption

The MVLC membership thanks all the members on this committee for their support and efforts in getting HB547 passed which removed the sunset and add Surviving Spouses.

Regrettably the Governor line item vetoed these provisions.

What still needs to be done:

- 1. Reintroduce language that adds SURVIVING SPOUSES.
- 2. Eliminates the sunset and make the Tax Exemption permanent

Reminder Who benefits?

- 100% of the ENLISTED RETIREES do not exceed the \$30,000 cap and thus all enlisted have their entire Military Retirement exempt from PIT.
- 100% of the SURVIVING SPOUSE do not exceed the \$30,000 cap and thus all enlisted have their entire Military Retirement exempt from PIT.
- Officers in the Rank of Major (Lt Cdr Navy) and below have their entire Military retirement exempt.
- Officers above the Rank of Major will pay PIT on the amounts over the Cap.
- Bottom Line NM Benefits Economically by attracting and retaining skilled Military Retirees in the State.

Veterans Property Tax Exemption

- In 2023 two Joint Resolutions (HJR 05 & 06) were introduced and passed to be on 2024 ballot.
 - A) To provide a \$10,000 exemption for all Veterans
 - B) To provide an exemption equal to their disability rating.
- If B or A&B are passed by the Voters in 2024 then they need to be melded to insure that Veterans who DO NOT have a disability rating (72% of all Veterans) still get a Property Tax Exemption.
- MVLC recommends that the implementing legislation for the revised Veterans Property Tax Exemption combine the two.

Veterans Mental Health & Homeless Initiatives

Two general Homeless bills were introduced in 2023 .

SB139 (Sen Rodrieguez) Appropriation for Homeless Services to Human Sevices Dept. (did not pass out of Senate)

HB358 (Rep Lujan) Appropriation for HOUSING & BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SVCS. (did not pass our of House)

In 2021 two Senate Bills were introduced neither passed.

SB 205 (Sen Tallman) proposed \$300K appropriation to DVS for outreach services for Homeless Veterans.

SB 275 (Sen Pope) introduced a comprehensive bill to address a broad range of Veterans issues to include Mental Health and Homelessness.

MVLC recommends that MVLC Legislative Team and this committee work with DVS to formulate initiatives addressing both issues.
