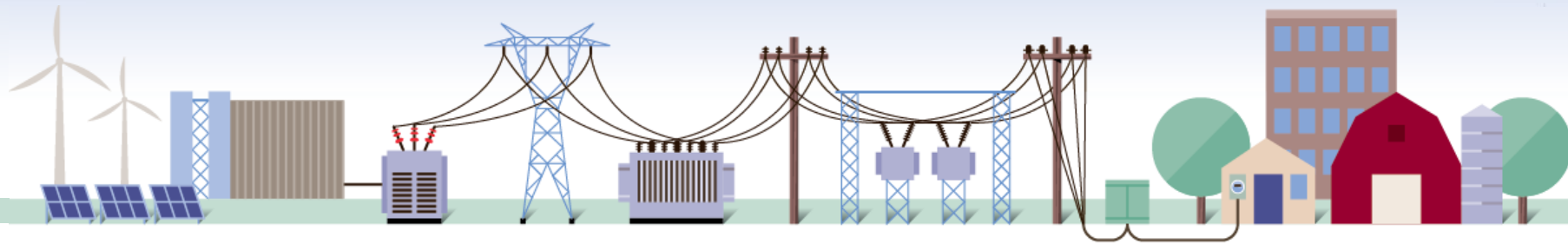

HOW ELECTRICITY GETS TO YOU



Generation

Electricity is generated from fossil fuel-fired (e.g., coal, natural gas, oil), nuclear, wind, solar, hydro and storage systems

Transmission line

High voltage electricity is moved over long distances through transmission lines

Distribution substation

Substations lower the voltage further for local use

Pad-mounted transformer

Voltage is reduced to the level that people use in their homes for electronics, appliances and lighting

Step-up transformer

Voltage is increased to push the electricity over long distances

Transmission substation

High voltage electricity is lowered for use on the local distribution system

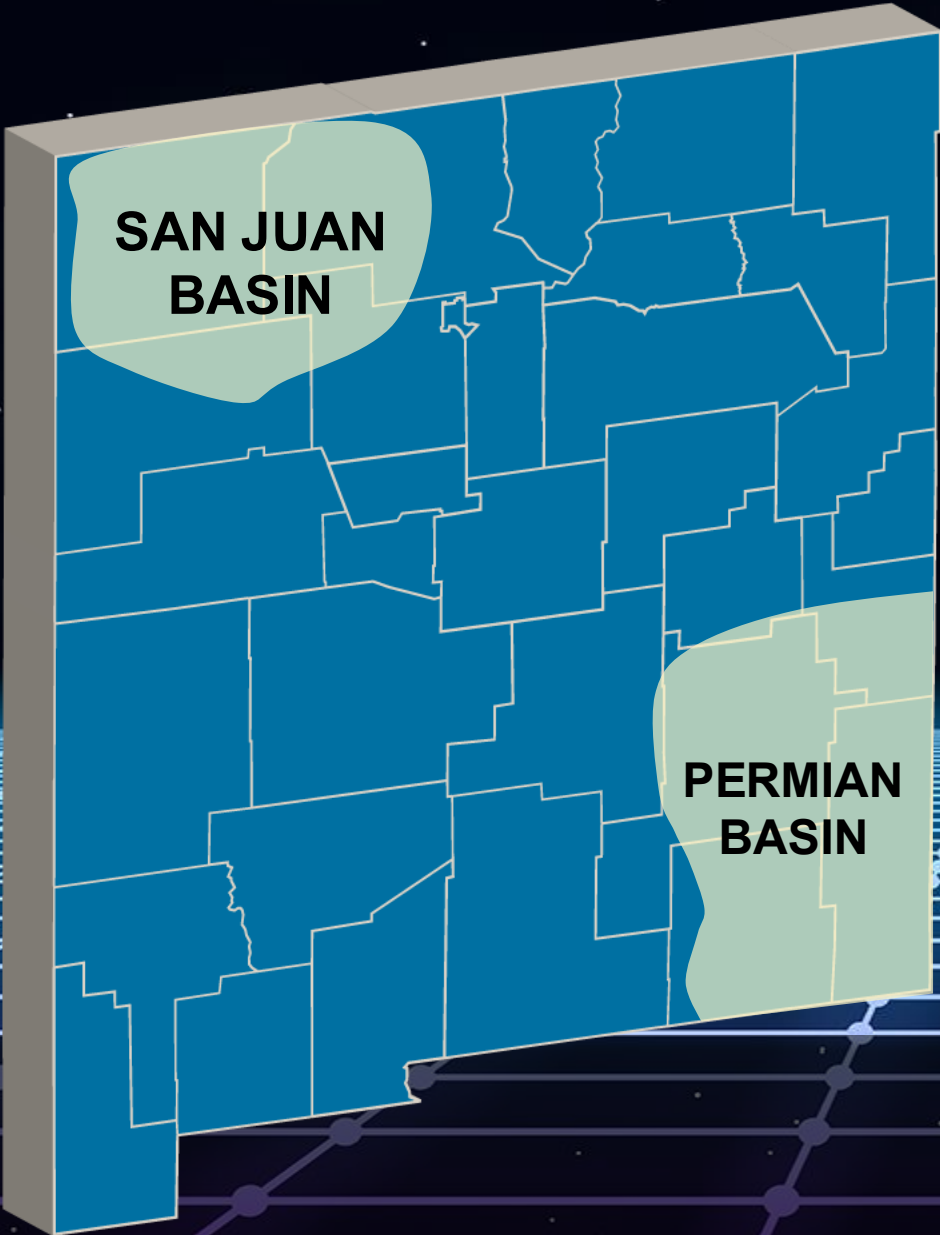
Distribution line

Low voltage electricity is carried to homes and businesses

Home, farm and business

Electricity flows to a meter, to a service panel and then to an outlet inside your home, farm or business

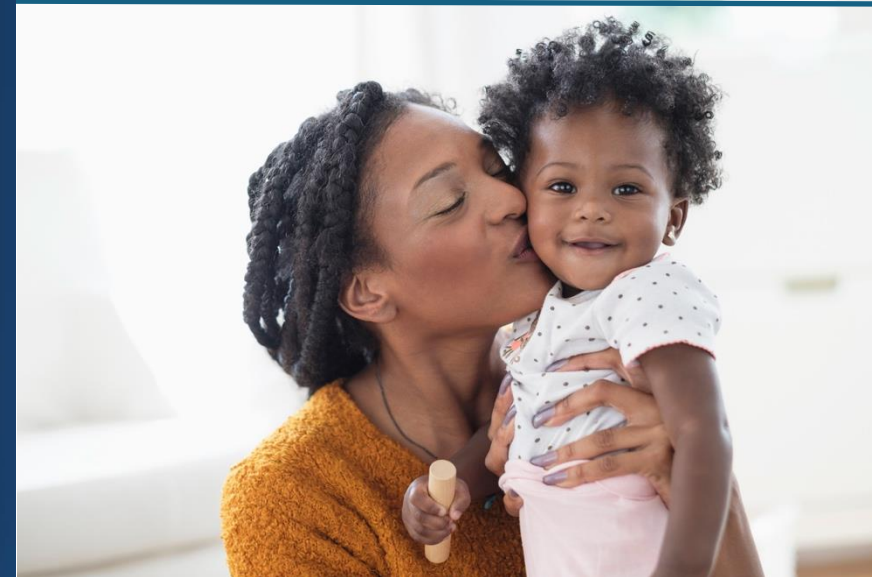

NM'S Regulatory Procedures

No Uniformity



- No Administrative Procedures Act governing rulemaking and other administrative proceedings
- State Rules Act Overlooked



Little-to-No Stakeholder Engagement Pre-Hearing



No Distinction between “technical evidence” and policy and legal arguments



Varying requirements for public notices, hearing procedures, timeframes, etc.

Regulatory Procedure Suggestions



Legislature of a Uniform Administrative Procedures Act



Include a “notice and comment” procedure that does away with a segmented, trial process – Saving Taxpayer Dollars



State agencies should be required to provide technical information and analysis in support of a proposed rule when the proposed rule is published and available for public comments.



There should be a uniform process for finalizing and publishing rules and for potential appeals.



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
