Rule's Purpose: The repeal eliminates the regulatory process by which the Public Education Department (PED)

administers its teacher leader network.

Summary of Repeal of NMAC 6.65.4: Teacher Leader Development Framework

PED's repeal of NMAC 6.65.4 eliminates regulatory provisions adopted in 2018. The notice of proposed rulemaking stated the department is repealing the rule because "the existing Teacher Development program is described in guidance."

Background. The Teacher Leader Development Network was developed by PED during the administration of former Governor Susana Martinez, but the previous rule was not adopted until the last month of her second term.

The previous rule defined the different roles available to educators as part of the program, including school liaisons, teacher ambassadors, the secretary's teacher advisory, and the teacher liaison. The rule specified the responsibilities of the teacher liaison, including implementing and managing the teacher leader program.

Impact

PED staff indicate the repeal of the rule will not change the way the teacher leader development program operates.
