








JGFD Mission Statement

- •1982: U.S. Supreme Court Decision, Mescalero v. NMDGF → Professional Wildlife Program Initiated
- •1983: Title 10 and BIA P.L. 93-638 Wildlife and Parks


JGFD- Present Day

- 4 Divisions: Law Enforcement, Parks and Recreation, Biological (Wildlife and Fisheries Management), Administration
- Responsibilities: Conservation, Management, Hunting/Fishing, Law Enforcement
- JGFD has <u>habitat and wildlife management jurisdiction</u>, which is an uncommon situation in the west
 - coordinate big game habitat and herd management strategies, resulting in spectacular hunting opportunities

























Economic Impact
